

in and defended the Charter of Rights, pointing out the Liberals understand it's important to protect minority rights.

He went on to say he thinks if Stephen Harper was the country's leader, "we would be in Iraq at this time."

Mr. Martin said in order for the Liberals to do what they want to do for Canada, "every progressive order has to come with us."

He urged the Liberals crowded into Mr. Carr's office to "reach out to the rest of the progressives," meaning those who support the NDP and Green Party.

The prime minister hugged Mr. Carr before heading out.

Milton resident Ken Lamb then asked the candidates what they would do to increase immigration rates, noting that it's currently going down but the population of seniors is increasing rapidly.

Mr. Turner said Canada's current immigration system hasn't been processing those coming into the country quickly enough.

"We need to clean that up and make sure it's efficient," he said.

He said the Conservatives also want to set up an agency that'll make sure immigrants' credentials are recognized in Canada.

"We want to make sure people coming here actually benefit Canada and all of our society," he said.

Mr. Naqvi shared similar sentiments, noting the NDP is also proposing to make the immigration system speedier.

He also said the discriminations need to be removed when it comes to recognizing immigrants' work experience and qualifications.

Mr. Carr pointed out that he supported a motion last year to set up a secretariat to oversee the foreign credential recognition program.

He told The Champion that the Liberals are also pushing to ensure more money is available to help process more people in the immigration system in a timely fashion.

The sparks flew again between the MP and Mr. Turner when Mr. Carr said he believes people don't want Stephen Harper and the 'Reformers' to get control of the country.

Mr. Turner rebutted that he's not in politics to try to win office by scaring people.

"I think you can stand up and scare people all you want," Mr. Turner told him, noting at the end of the day that doesn't help Canada.
