

Town mistakenly posts election sign

Many local residents were surprised to see a Town of Milton sign carrying an endorsement for the Conservative party last weekend. Director of Community Services Jennifer Reynolds, whose department looks after the various Town signs around town, said the booking for the sign at the corner of Main and Ontario streets was accepted in error by staff and was put up on Sunday. After noticing the mistake when driving by it on Monday morning, Ms Reynolds said she had it taken down immediately. The Town has a policy when it comes to signs, she said, of not accepting bookings for offensive, religious or political messaging.

Regional Road 25 Transportation Corridor Highway 401 to Campbellville Road, Town of Milton Class Environmental Assessment Study

The Regional Municipality of Halton is carrying out a Class Environmental Assessment to consider a wide range of options for transportation corridor improvements to satisfy future travel demands on Regional Road 25, from Highway 401 to Campbellville Road, in the Town of Milton (see map below). The need to satisfy north-south capacity requirements in this transportation corridor has been identified in previous studies including the Region of Halton Transportation Master Plan (2004). This study is being conducted in compliance with Schedule C of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

The first Public Information Centre was held on June 15, 2005. Thereafter, the preferred alternative was determined taking into consideration the problem being addressed, alternative solutions, environmental effects, and comments that were received from the Town of Milton, regulatory agencies and the public. The preferred alternative includes the widening of Regional Road 25 to four lanes with a partially raised centre median and intersection improvements.

A second Public Information Centre has been arranged to review the preferred alternative and receive public comments. Following the information centre, the preferred alternative will be reviewed taking into consideration the comments received, and confirmed or modified.




