Milton Players production provides a fun night out

Sweet. Funny. Poignant. Thoughtful. Memorable. These are just a few of the words that sprung to mind after taking in the Milton Players' latest show, The Curious Savage, Friday night at the Milton Seniors' Activity Centre.

With an armload of lessons to be gleaned, this is one of those plays you'll find yourself discussing afterward and it seems, if my boyfriend and I are any indication, that everyone gathers a different message.

Essentially, it's about simpletons who are surprisingly wise and professionals who are pathetically foolish. It's about making the most out of life, no matter what the circumstances, and appreciating those who have a different outlook.

I strongly urge anyone looking for a fun night out to take advantage of this charming story.

The play revolves around the sharp-tongued Ethel Savage who's sent to a sanitarium by her greedy stepchildren who can't comprehend her desire to dole out the money from her husband's inheritance through her memorial fund. This fund is for wise people who want to pursue their foolish dreams. It's for people — like Mrs. Savage — who've lived their entire lives doing acceptable, proper things who want to experience life on a whim.

foolish things they always wanted," she declares.

Sharon Beddoes' hard work portraying someone much older than herself has paid off. From her mannerisms to her dress to her voice, Mrs. Savage is every bit the old woman.

Set in the 1950s, the opening scene introduces the audience to a hodgepodge of characters who live together in The Cloisters. They're offbeat, naïve and slightly delusional in one way or another. They're also incredibly likeable.

There's Fairy May, played by Veronica Hernandez, an insecure girl who needs to be told each day she's loved and revels in being the beauty of the group — even if she's

There's Jeffrey, played by Brian Cranford, who's not quite the same after returning from war, and the grumpy Mrs. Patty, played by Leanne Dalgliesh, who's silent except to recite all the things she hates in life.

The group quickly wins over the audience, thanks in no small part to the skills of the actors.

Mrs. Savage's three step children, played by Geoff Ford, Eleanor Gribbon and newcomer Ben McFarlane are convincingly unlikable, especially when they find out mother dearest has hidden \$10 million and won't tell them where. The lengths to which they'll go to get their hands on the money makes for some very humorous situations.

Not to be left out, Tim Beddoes and Lynette Austin are wonderful in their roles as doctor and sanitarium director.


