Turner says Liberal defector should do 'honourable thing'

Newly-elected Halton MP Garth Turner is calling for Liberal defector David Emerson's resignation, saying he should run again for his seat as a Conservative in a by-election.

The local politician made the comments Thursday on Parliament Hill, where he and fellow Conservative MP Myron Thompson both said Emerson needs to go back to his constituents — who elected him three weeks ago as a Liberal and look for their approval on his party change.

In speaking with The Champion Friday, Turner said he hopes the Vancouver MP will do the "honourable thing" and seek a by-election.


