Municipalities send clear message to Province on 'Places to Grow' plan

The Province needs to do a better job when it comes to consulting with the public on its proposed Places to Grow plan.

That's one of the messages the Region and its municipalities deliver in so dear to the Places to Grow philosopen in Ontario. a joint response paper they recently sent to the minister of public infrastructure renewal regarding the initiative, which aims to stop urban sprawl and focus compact development on urban growth centres, including downtown Milton and Burlington and midtown Oakville.

Other recommendations to the Province contained within the joint submission, which Halton council endorsed at its meeting last week, include:

- Recognizing the important contribution of the local municipalities in setting and implementing policies of the growth plan.
- Enunciating a clear strategy in dealing with the management of sold waste and bio-solids in the Greater Golden Horseshoe.
- Ensuring adequate funding is available to meet the human services needs of the future population, in addition to building community infrastruc-

Prior to approving the response paper at last week's meeting, regional council members first heard local residents' concerns regarding the Places to Grow plan.

Local farmer Lieven Gevaert, acting on behalf of the Milton Rural Residents Association, noted the group feels that no green land in Halton should be urbanized before 2021.


