Wednesday's series clincher, came at Memorial Arena, where the IceHawks went 26-0-1 until the Blades ended that streak in game three.

Milton was number one for much of the season. Not just in the league standings but also in the national Jr. A rankings. Even after having coach and general manager George Dupont suspended December 1, the IceHawks rolled on like a well-oiled machine. And maybe it all came just a little too easy for them.

"We never got into a situation where we had to face some adversity and when we did, we didn't handle it as well as we could have," Caister said. "Maybe we just weren't used to that because we didn't get it done."

Despite outplaying the Blades, Milton trailed 3-1 nearing the end of the second period. Chase Langeraap cut the lead to one shortly before intermission, scoring after a Milton goal had been waived off because the net had been knocked loose.

When Jason Bergeron tied the game six minutes into the third, the IceHawks appeared to have all the momentum going their way. However, for the third straight game they struggled to beat Oakville's Marc Stuart, who stopped 32 of 34 shots despite missing the latter half of the second period after he took a skate to the head, opening a cut above his right eye.

"We worked so hard for 60 minutes," Caister said. "We were down two or three times and kept coming back. It just seemed like every time they got a chance, they capitalized. We get 50 shots a game and can't score. That's the way it goes. Skill-wise, we were the superior team but when it comes down to one night...."

And that's where Milton lost the series. Not on Wednesday night. But by putting themselves in a one game, winner-take-all showdown.

And when they lost that they left a lot of people wondering, what if?
