**NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE #2**

The Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) has a level crossing within the urban area of Milton located on Main Street East, immediately east of Ontario Street. A grade separation is warranted at this crossing based on rail and road traffic volumes. Therefore, the Town of Milton is carrying out a study of the Main Street East / CPR Grade Separation, in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) process, which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. McCormick Rankin Corporation is assisting the Town in carrying out the study.

The first Public Information Centre was held on May 10, 2005. Thereafter, the preferred alternative for the proposed Main Street / CPR grade separation was determined and includes realigning Main Street to the south as an underpass to the CPR tracks. A second Public Information Centre has been arranged to review the preferred alternative and the proposed mitigation measures. Following the information centre, the preferred alternative will be reviewed taking into consideration the comments received, and confirmed or modified.

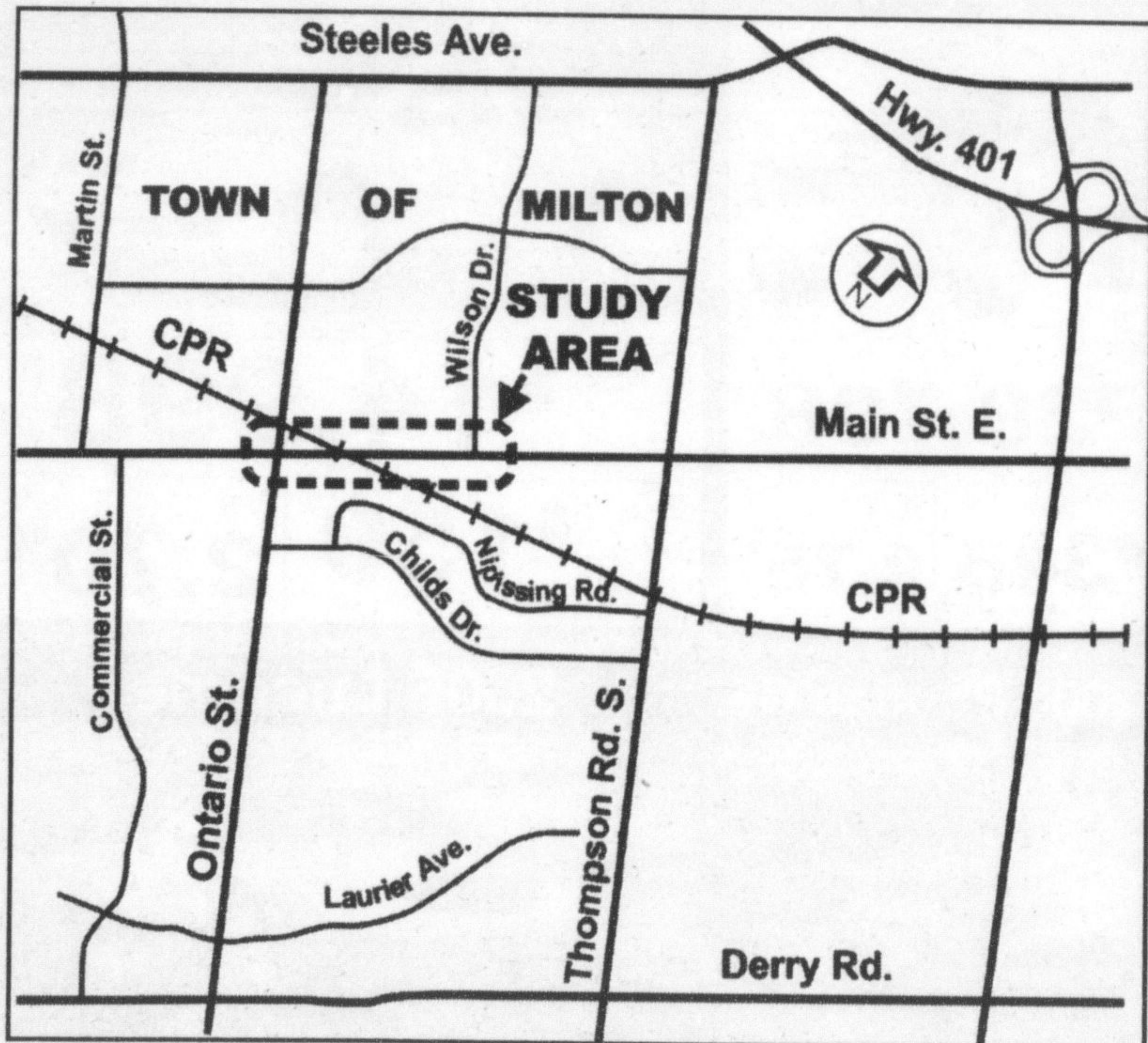

# Halton Region doesn't solicit water samples door-to-door

The Region is reminding residents that its staff never solicits water samples by going door-to-door.

Citizens who may be approached from time to time by private companies offering to test water samples from their taps should be aware that all Halton staff members carry photo identification and will always show it to anyone upon request.

The Region's water quality sampling and testing is stringently completed by Halton staff

at the five water purification plants and throughout the water distribution system.

"One of Halton Region's most important responsibilities is providing residents with clean, safe, drinking water, whether that water comes from Lake Ontario or a municipal well," said Halton CAO Brent Marshall.

"Halton residents expect the best from Halton Region and that is why we continue to work hard to make sure we consistently meet or exceed provincial

water quality standards set by the Ministry of the Environment to ensure all residents receive the highest quality of water."

A press release from the Region said it's also important residents know Halton staff operating the water plants and water distribution system are highly qualified and licensed and perform regular analytical testing of the system in strict accordance with provincial regulations.

# More election candidates register

Two more local residents have filed their papers to run in this fall's municipal election.

Jim Timbers has put his name forward for the position of Ward 2 councillor. The Miltonian ran for the same spot in the 2000 election.

And current Ward 4 Councillor Wendy Schau — a retired elementary school teacher — is vying

to keep her seat for a second term.

Also registered to run is Milton Ratepayers' Association president Kevin Brackley, who's seeking the title of Ward 1 councillor.

Nominations can be filed at the Town clerk's office, located in Town Hall Victoria Park, 43 Brown St. Election day is November 13.

# Hearing continues in death of dentist

A preliminary hearing will continue this month for an Orillia man charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of a Milton dentist.

Adam Holland, 22, will appear at Ontario Court of Justice in Midland from March 27 to 31

for the hearing, which began February 20 to 24.

Dr. David Dumencu, 42, was found lying unconscious with head injuries in the parking lot of an Orillia-area tavern in July 2004. He was taken to an Orillia hospital and then transferred to a Toronto hospital where he died two days later.

He told the cashier and customer to go behind the dispensary counter and dumped a wide variety of narcotics from the storage facility into his bag. He then demanded cash and went to the register, taking an undisclosed amount of money.

As the robber was leaving the store, he told the three people to "get down on the ground," police said. He fled, but it's unknown if the man got into a vehicle.

Fortunately, there were no injuries resulting from the ordeal.

"Anytime narcotics are involved, it's somewhat aggressive because the perpetrators are usually drug addicts as opposed to bank robbers who are just looking for cash," Taylor said.

He couldn't comment on the amount of drugs stolen.

Taylor said the trio in the pharmacy when the robbery occurred did just what they should have — they co-operated.

"Never, ever resist," Taylor said. "The sooner they get the stuff, the sooner they'll get out of there."

Police are asking for the public's help in finding the robber, who's described as white, about 25 years old, five-foot-11 and about 160 pounds. He was wearing blue one-piece coveralls, black work boots and a grey handkerchief over the lower part of his face.
