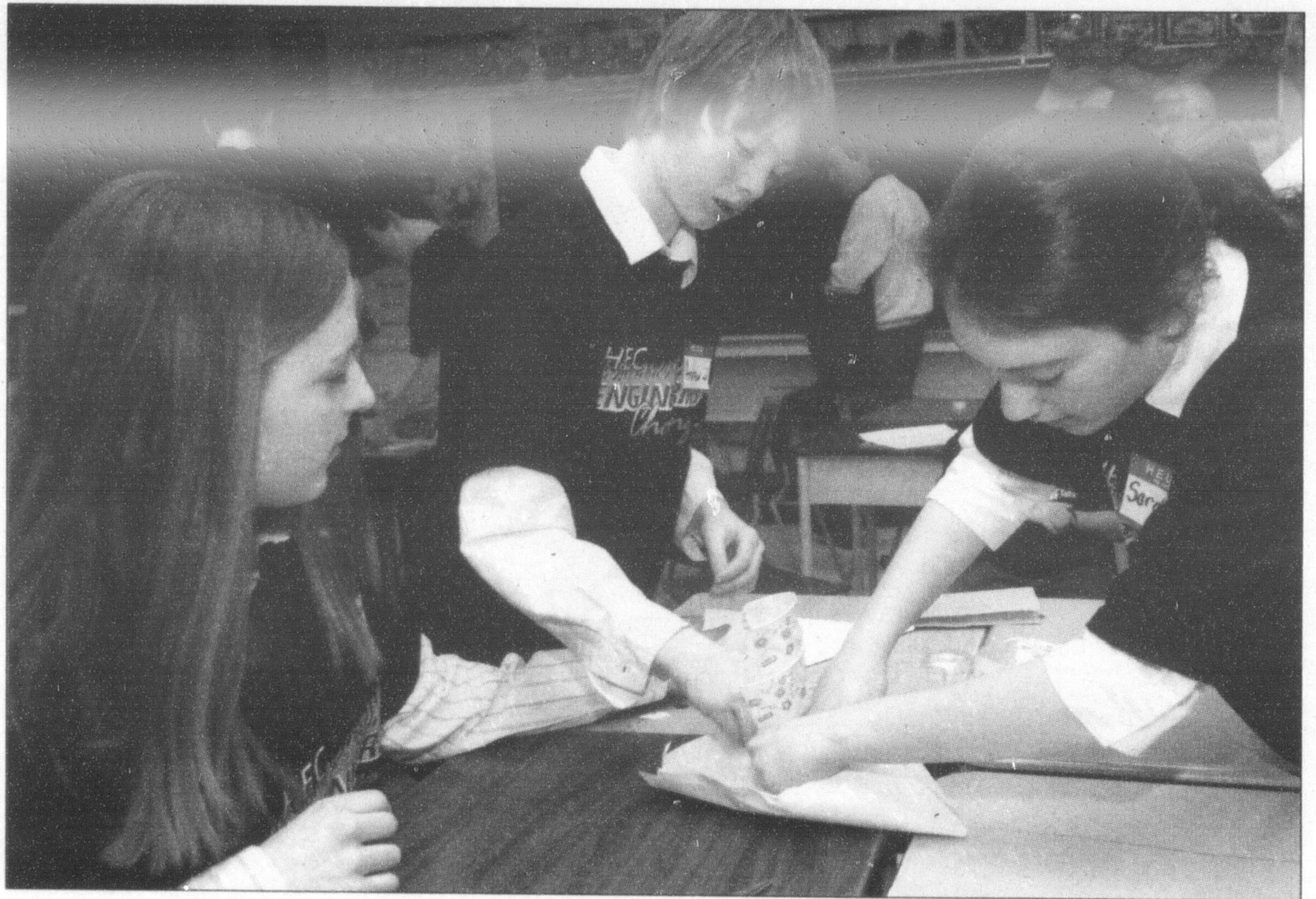

Special Notice from Milton Fire Department

For several years now, the Milton Fire Department has been actively involved in the **Home Safe Home Program** as part of a Province wide initiative. However some of the most law-abiding people are unknowingly breaking the law and others know better. Not for robbery, or speeding, or assault. But simply because they don't have working smoke alarms in their homes.

Working Smoke Alarms: It's the Law

A recent amendment to the **Ontario Fire Code** will require homes to have working smoke alarms on every level. This is in addition to the existing requirement of having smoke alarms outside all sleeping areas. The amendment applies to all single-family, semi-detached, and town homes, whether owner occupied or rented.

Homeowners — this may mean purchasing additional smoke alarms and installing them, on every level of their home and outside all sleeping areas. Failure to do so could result in a ticket of \$235.00.

Landlords — you must make sure your rental properties comply with the law. Individual landlords who fail to comply with the Fire Code smoke alarm requirements can face a fine of up to \$50,000.00.

Tenants of Rental Properties — tenants are encouraged to contact their landlords immediately if they do not have the required number of smoke alarms. Once smoke alarms are installed, tenants cannot remove batteries or tamper with the smoke alarm in any way. If they do so, the tenant could be subject to a ticket for \$235.00.


This amendment came into effect March 1, 2006. The Fire Department strongly recommends that owners ensure their properties are in compliance with the provincial law.

Ontario fire statistics reveal that in about 50 percent of fatal homes fires, the victims had no smoke alarm warning.
