Evening ofHope for victims of cancer

It's often said there's strength in numbers.

That saying should ring true Sunday night as dozens of local cancer survivors and their families come together to support each other at St. Paul's United Church's Evening of Hope.

The event, which will include inspirational music and prayers, is designed for both those who've overcome cancer and others who've lost loved ones to the illness.

Organizer and St. Paul's community co-ordinator outreach Edward Bellsmith explained the evening will also fill a void in the support system cancer patients need. "There's a lot of medical support available for cancer patients, but there doesn't seem to be a lot of emotional or spiritual support for them and their families. I think there's a real need in the community."

The night will highlight the stories of cancer survivors. It will also include a candle-lighting ceremony to honour loved ones who've been affected by cancer and a talk by Oakville Mayor Ann Mulvale.

Bellsmith said Mulvale lost her husband to cancer and was then diagnosed herself, but was able to overcome the illness. "She has quite a story to tell."

In addition, Wellspring and the Canadian Cancer Society will be on hand to provide information about their services and an opportunity to make a donation.


Bellsmith said the Evening of Hope is based on a similar event held at a United church in Brampton.

"It really struck a chord of response for people in that community," he said.

And so far, the feedback from local residents on the event has been equally as favourable, with Bellsmith estimating about 400 people will attend.
