

Missing woman located

A local mother of two who has been missing since December has returned home.

Cory Way, 26, returned home March 15 safe and sound, police confirmed Wednesday.

The woman had been staying in Toronto as police had suspected, said Det. Sgt. Peter Hodgson of Halton Regional Police.

She had left home on her own accord, he said.

"We're very happy she returned and is safe," Hodgson said.

Way had last been seen in Milton December 29 and was spotted several times in Toronto.

Ms Way's children are aged 10 months and 22 months. Sadly, while she was missing, her husband, Jason Way, died.

Report details town council's salaries

The Town spent a little over \$240,000 on council members' salaries in 2005.

A report presented to the administration and planning committee Monday night detailed how much each councillor and the mayor received in remuneration, including the cost of benefits, mileage and attending conferences.

In the salary department, Mayor Gord Krantz topped the list at \$46,720. Each councillor earned \$20,061, with the exception of Ward 4 Councillor John Challinor who

received \$15,145.

Challinor has told The Champion it's his choice to have a lower salary and explained the money he gets is adequate to cover everything he needs to do as a councillor.

Almost \$20,000 was dished out for benefits, with \$3,868 of that going to Krantz. Other council members' benefits fell within the \$1,000 to \$2,000 range, except for Challinor who only used \$871.

Six councillors and the mayor spent close to

\$12,000 on conferences and workshops — Ward 3 Councillor Jan Mowbray, \$2,833, Wards 2 and 4 Councillor Ron Furik, \$2,359.40, Ward 3 Councillor Cindy Lunau, \$1,498, Krantz, \$1,371, Ward 4 Councillor Wendy Schau, \$1,340, Ward 2 Councillor Mark Curtis, \$1,309 and Ward 1 Councillor Brian Penman, \$1,233.

And only five members of council claimed mileage for the year — Krantz, \$4,870, Lunau, \$2,570, Wards 1 and 3 Councillor Barry Lee, \$1,717, Penman, \$1,323 and Mowbray, \$934.

More industrial developments on way to town

Several new industrial developments are in the works around Milton.

Amongst the companies coming to town are ORE Development Corporation, Total Developments International (TDI) and Greiner-Pacaud Management Associates (GPM).

ORE has put plans forward for lands north of Hwy. 401, just south of Lawson Road. Town Economic Development Manager Andrew Siltala said several buildings are in the works at the site, with construction anticipated to wrap

up by the end of summer.

He noted the buildings will contain multiple 14,300-square-foot units that can be leased, and deals with four tenants have already been made.

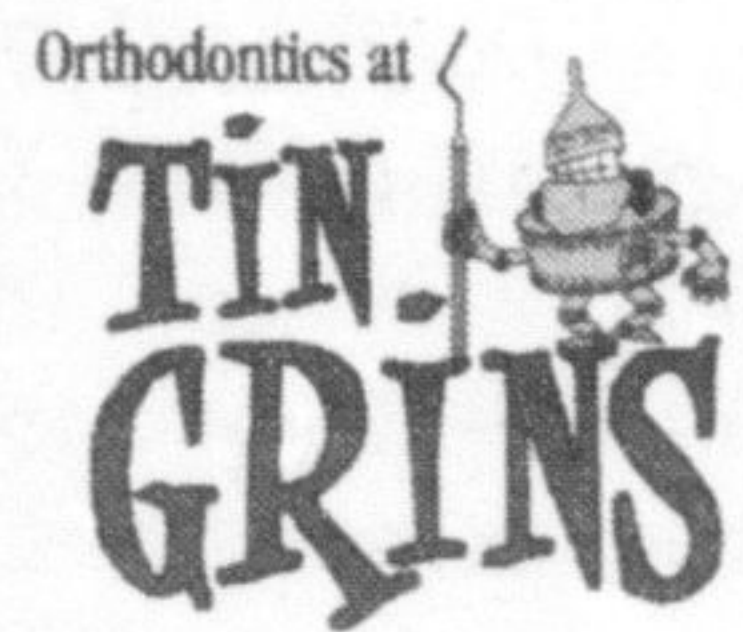
Across town, Siltala said TDI has sold part of its property — located west of Regional Road 25, near Campbellville Road — to two companies that plan to build industrial facilities this year. The names of those businesses have yet to be announced.

Also at the same site, Siltala noted 67 acres

have been sold to the Hospitals of Ontario Pension Plan, which also intends to build in 2006. This development will include a mix of small and large industrial buildings.

Meanwhile, GPM is taking over the OI Canada property on Chisholm Drive and redeveloping it with industrial buildings that'll be 20,000 square feet and up.

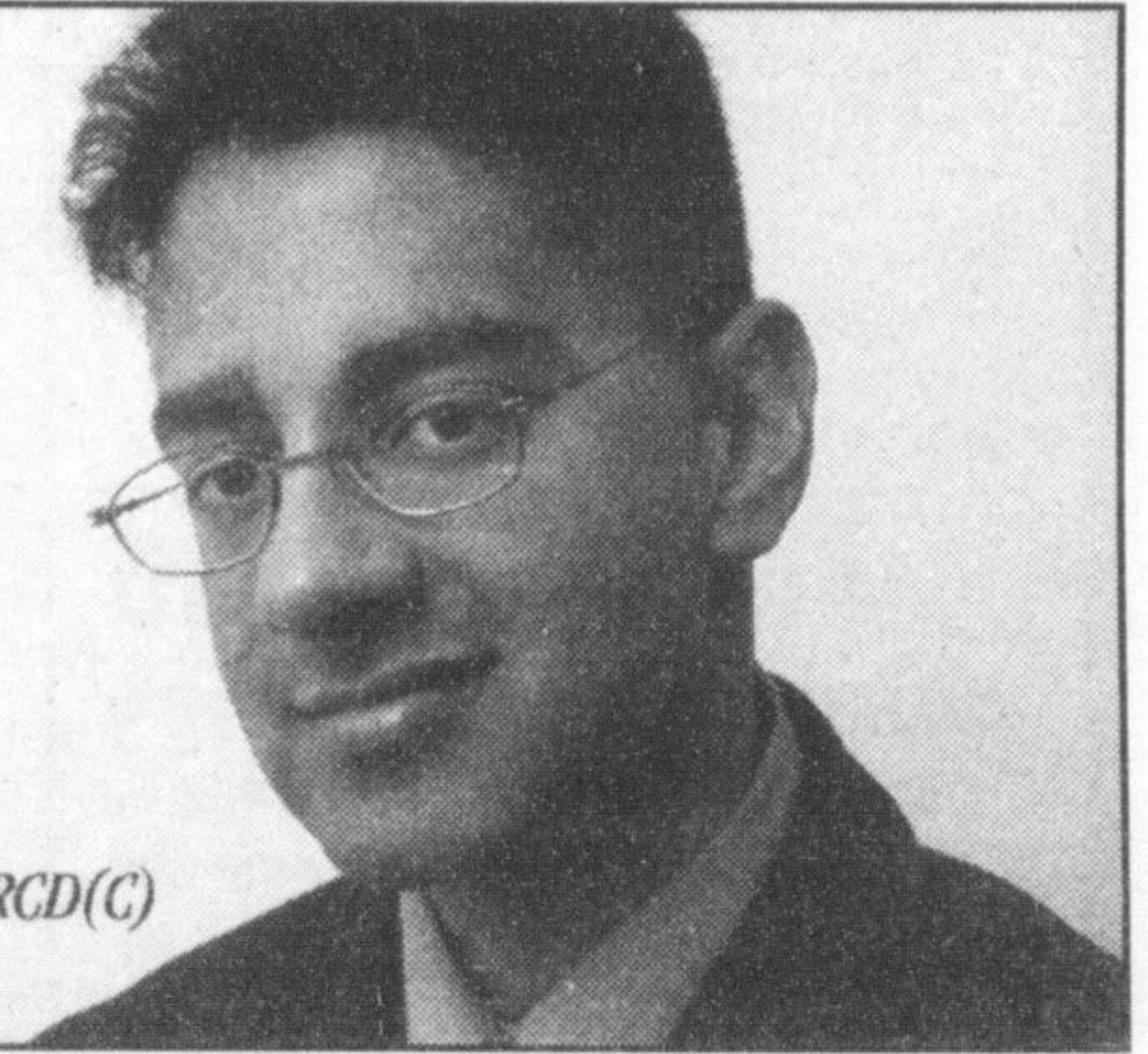
Part of the redevelopment includes demolishing portions of the existing buildings. This will take place next Friday.
