Tykes sweep Tri County final

Milton's rep tykes combined dominance and drama this past weekend to complete their Tri County championship run.

The latter came in Carlisle Sunday afternoon, with the Winterhawks pulling out a 3-2 overtime victory to solidify a best-of-five series sweep of the Flamborough Sabres.

Michael Hunter manoeuvered past a couple of defenders and buried a low wrister past the hometown goalie to clinch the title shortly after the hosts forced sudden death with just eight seconds remaining in regulation.

Jacob Wickware and Antonio Traetto also scored in the series-clinching win, while Chris Pelow backstopped the tykes to victory.

At Memorial Arena Saturday evening, the Winterhawks put Flamborough on the ropes with a commanding 6-0 whitewash — thanks to exceptional cage work by Zach Plater and a four-goal explosion from Jonathan Vaca.

His linemates were equally impressive, with Justin Whetham contributing a goal and two assists and Wickware counting three helpers.

Milton's other goal came from Jacob Collier.

This marked the second Tri County championship in three years for the local tykes.


The Winterhawks had two other cracks at a Tri County title this week, with both the additional entry novices and AE2 atoms both falling short.
