

soar Into final four

Holy Rosary's girls basketball team has secured one championship, and remains in the hunt for another.

Less than 48 hours removed from their North Halton title win, the Hawks advanced to the region's final four with a 34-32 squeaker over Oakville's St. John's Wednesday afternoon at Bishop Reding Secondary School.

The too-close-for-comfort victory pushed Holy Rosary's lady cagers — North Halton champs four times in the last six years — as far as they've gone in recent memory. "We were well disciplined today and played as a team," said head coach Cindy Johnston, moments after edging their favoured Oakville opponents. "Plus our defense was awesome and we worked the fast break when we needed it."

Alex Schroder led the quarterfinal win with a dozen points, while Lauren Furik made back-to-back baskets early in the fourth quarter to put the Hawks ahead to stay. Also standing out with nine points was Carly Fullerton.

Holy Rosary put itself in the quarterfinal showdown with a 1-1 round-robin campaign Wednesday, capping its split with a 32-25 decision over St. Dominic.


This followed a North Halton championship repeat over Georgetown's St. Brigid Monday afternoon at Guardian Angels School. The 24-15 final was a little more decisive than the score would indicate, as St. Brigid sank a couple of last-minute baskets after Johnston threw in her supporting cast to finish out the game.

Fullerton fueled the victory with 11 points, while Schroder chipped in five. A rock-solid defence factored heavily

into the win as well. The Hawks will now compete in the Halton semifinals April 18 at Joan of Arc in Oakville, and if victorious will vie for the regional crown at Oakville's St. Thomas Aquinas April 20.
