Town and regional councillor candidate registers to run

Milton's Tony Lambert has thrown his hat in the ring as a candidate for this fall's municipal election.

The area resident is running for the position of Wards 1 and 3 councillor — a seat that represents Miltonians at the local and regional council tables.


While Lambert — who's lived in town for six years now — is a newcomer to the political scene, he's already got big plans that he wants to implement if elected.

"I became interested in running for council because I was alarmed by the traffic congestion, rate of tax increase and serious crimes being committed (in Milton)," he said. "My number one priority will be to bring new, fresh ideas to council to solve these three things."

On the traffic front, the Ward 1 resident said he thinks the Town needs a "better deal" when it comes to funding from the Province and developers to bring local roads up to par before all the new homes are built and occupied.

"We should deal with developers from a position of strength and say, 'Let's have the roads built beforehand'. If we do it now, we won't have traffic congestion," he said. "It's important to have an aggressive and effective voice for Milton in dealing with the Province and also for establishing a new arrangement with developers."

Lambert said he'd also like to reduce or freeze property taxes through re-examining the Town's costs, priorities and pos-

sible sources of revenue.

"We should ask for the input of the citizens on this," he said. "I believe we can get 3,000 to 4,000 people to respond if we use e-mail."

This ties into another of Lambert's priorities if he's elected — improving communication between council and Miltonians.

"There is a communication gap between citizens and their council," he said, noting that he has a great respect for the current council and isn't criticizing its members but, "We're not using 21st-century technology to solicit input."

In addition, the 38-year-old said he'd like to improve the safety of the town's neighbour-hoods and roads by equipping police with the tools they need to keep crime at a minimum.

"We also need to look at ways of taking responsibility ourselves through things like community watch programs,"

he said. "We should work closer with police."

Other things on Lambert's agenda include making the downtown core more "vibrant and alive" — similar to Niagara-on-the-Lake — and helping solve Milton's doctor shortage through networking, marketing and working with the Province.

Lambert was born and raised in Toronto. He's been a stock-broker for 13 years and currently works for TD Waterhouse. He's also the founder of the Milton Safe Communities Association and the Milton Taxpayers Association.

The current Wards 1 and 3 Councillor is Barry Lee.

A few other local residents have put their names forward to run in the municipal election.

Jim Timbers is vying for the position of Ward 2 councillor, while current Ward 4 Councillor Wendy Schau is hoping to keep her seat for a second term.

Also registered to run is Milton Ratepayers' Association president Kevin Brackley, who's seeking the title of Ward 1 councillor.

Nominations can be filed at the Town Clerk's office, located in Town Hall Victoria Park, 43 Brown St., until September 28 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. and on September 29 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

It costs \$100 to register as a candidate. Election day is November 13. The term of office will run from December 1, 2006 to November 30, 2009.




