In the last days of the trial, Crocker had argued that searches done on Vastis's property were unconstitutional under the Canadian Charter of Rights and

But Woloschuk found the visits on the property weren't a breach of the Charter. And since Vastis didn't live on the property, there was a "limited expectation of privacy" anyway, he said.




