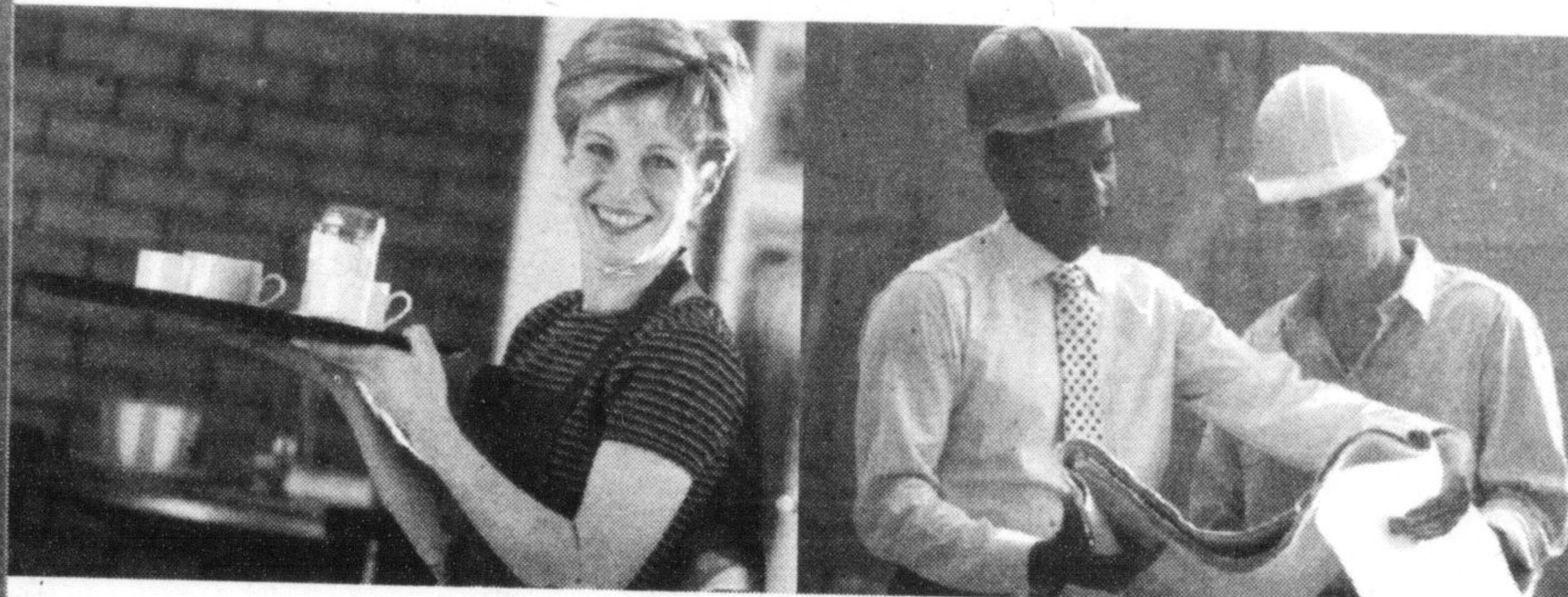

Directions for residents coming from the west of Halton Region: travel east on Derry Rd. (pass the Milton District Hospital), left on Commercial St. and left on Williams Ave.

Lowndes Holdings Corporation is proposing a new, 154 ha quarry west of Milborough Line, with the municipal address of 475 to 515 11th Concession Road East, Hamilton. As this site is located immediately across the Halton/Hamilton municipal boundary, a public information session is being held to focus specifically on Halton's issues.

The proposal is to extract three million tonnes of dolostone per year to produce crushed rock for road construction, concrete and asphalt products. Truck routes could potentially pass through the City of Burlington or Town of Milton. An Environmental Assessment (EA) type process and public consultation will take place to assess the needs and select potential trucking routes.

The City of Hamilton is leading the review of Lowndes' submission in consultation with the public and agencies including Halton Region, City of Burlington and Town of Milton. This public information session is an opportunity for Halton residents to make their views known early in the process. 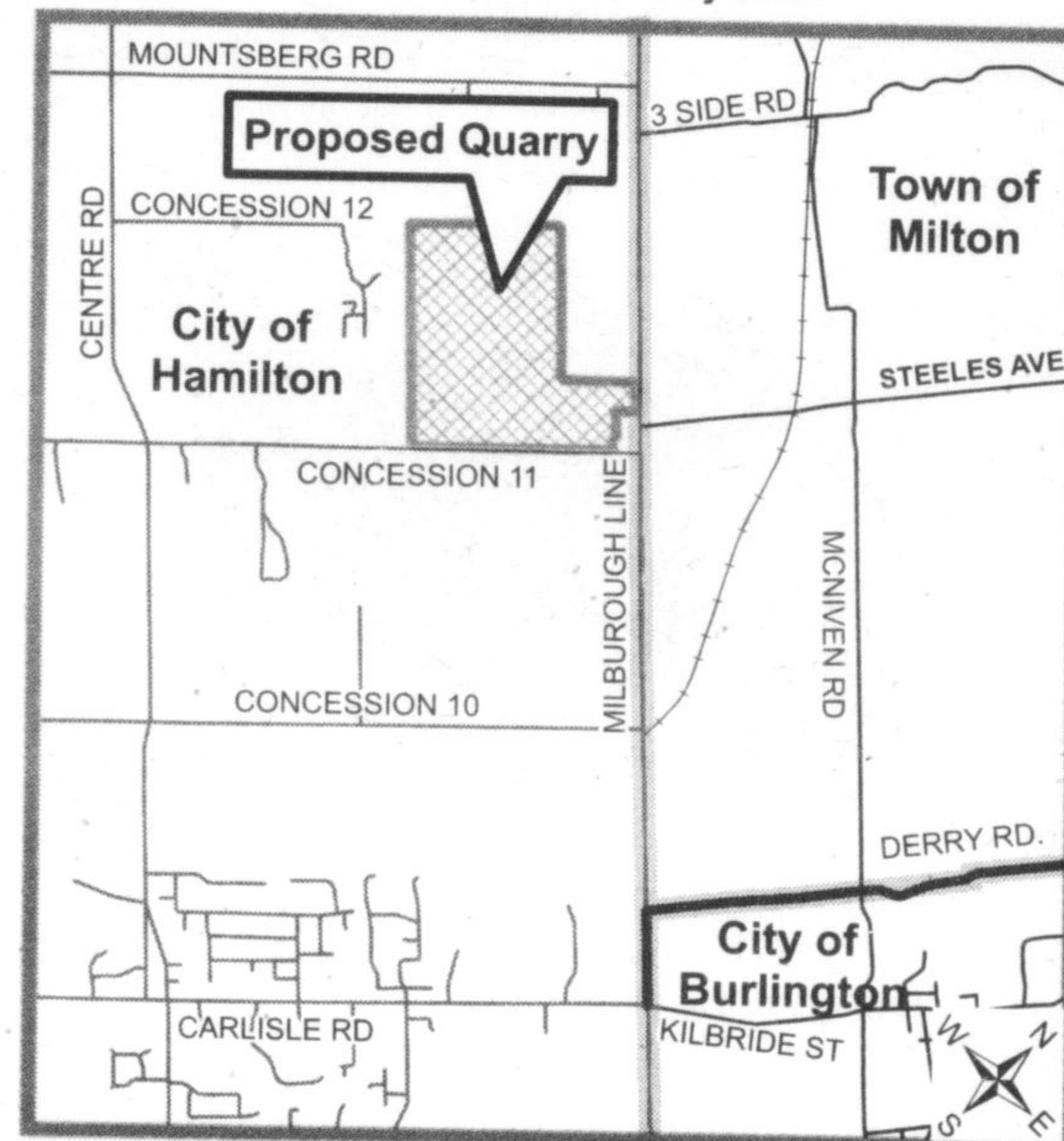
