



Blaze starts in attic

An estimated \$75,000 damage was caused to a rural Milton home during an evening fire last Tuesday.

Both Milton and Oakville firefighters responded to the blaze at 9 p.m. at a Sixth Line residence — just north of Lower Base Line.

It took about 40 minutes to extinguish the fire, said Barry Kory, training co-ordinator for the Milton Fire Department.

The blaze originated in the attic and caused extensive smoke and water damage to the home's roof and upstairs area, Kory said.

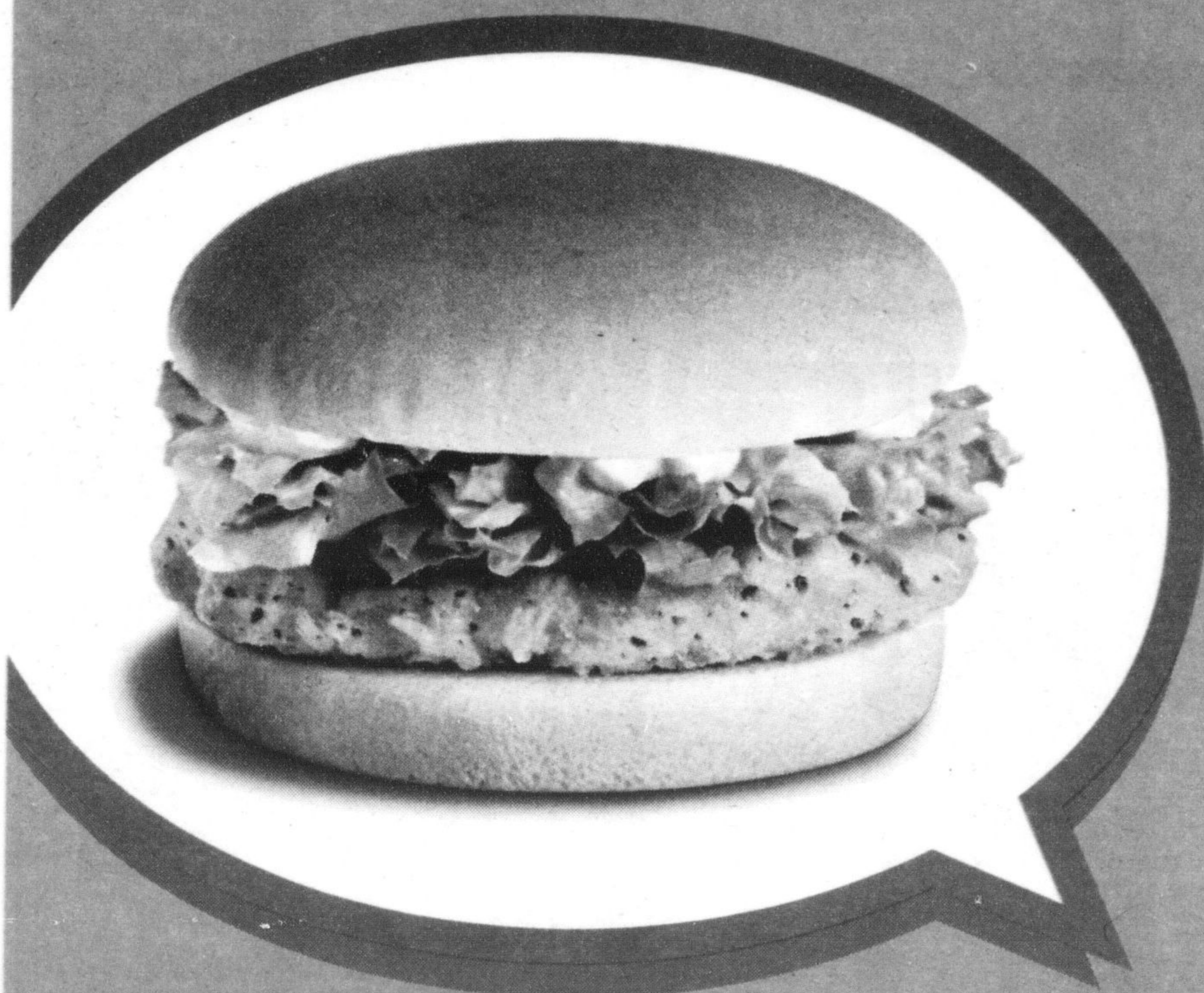
No one was injured in the fire.

The cause of the blaze was unknown at press time, and was still being investigated.
