

Meeting on proposed quarry Sun.

A local environmental group is organizing a public session to discuss its objections to a new quarry in north Halton.

Protecting Escarpment Rural Land (PERL), a Burlington-based citizen advocacy group, is opposed to the opening of a quarry on the Niagara Escarpment.


It will hold an information session Sunday about Nelson Aggregate's proposed quarry on Mount Nemo. PERL says the quarry would cause "devastating impacts to the escarpment and surrounding community, such as threatening wetlands, water supply, natural habitats and endangered species."

The drop-in event will cover topics like the impacts of what's being proposed, endangered species and habitats potentially at risk, as well as provide a petition to stop approval of the quarry and the pick-up of a PERL lawn sign.
