Highlight stellar season with provincial championship win

coach Doug Veldman.

He figures the girls' composure in those nail-biting battles can be attributed to spending some time up at the 16and-under level this season, with solid showings at two tournaments and a silver-medal performance at the 16U provincials last month in Barrie.

Noted Veldman, "That was the whole purpose, to get them ready for the 15-and-under provincials."

The Storm's 15-and-under provincial championship was punctuated with a 20-25, 25-14, 15-9 win over the Niagara Splash. Miltonian Meg Rector led the way with topnotch
