



CONSTRUCTION ROAD IMPROVEMENTS TOWN OF MILTON

The Planning and Public Works Committee for the Regional Municipality of Halton proposes at its meeting on Wednesday, June 14, 2006 at 9:30 a.m. to recommend to Regional Council at its meeting of Wednesday, June 21, 2006 at 9:30 a.m. to pass a By-law for the construction of the north leg of a new intersection, to be located 770m west of Bronte Street, on Derry Road and a right-in/right-out access 110 m west of the new intersection, in the Town of Milton.

Construction drawings showing the works may be reviewed at the Planning & Public Works Department, Halton Regional Centre, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville.

Notice of Pesticide Use

The Halton Region Health Department monitors standing water and catch basins in urban areas on public lands in Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton, and Oakville for mosquito larvae. When mosquito larvae are found, the Health Department uses larvicide to control mosquito larvae in order to reduce the incidence of West Nile virus in Halton. Larvicide will be applied by a licensed applicator contracted by the Region.

In Standing Water

Throughout the summer, the Halton Region Health Department will apply larvicide to standing water sites under the direction of the Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Bob Nosal. A granular formulation of the larvicide Bti (*Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis*), Aquabac™ 200G, registration number 26863, will be placed in affected standing water on public lands in urban areas in Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton, and Oakville. Signs will be posted at each location indicating when the larvicide was applied.

In Catch Basins

Throughout the summer through October 31, 2006, the Halton Region Health Department will apply larvicide to catch basins under the direction of the Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Bob Nosal. A pellet and/or briquet formulation of the larvicide methoprene (Altocid®), registration number 21809 for pellet formulation, 27694 for briquet formulation, will be placed in catch basins in urban areas on public lands in Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton, and Oakville.

The Smoke-Free Ontario Act



As of May 31, new legislation is coming into effect that will help improve the health of all Halton residents and residents of Ontario. The Smoke-Free Ontario Act effectively bans smoking in all enclosed public places and workplaces.

This new legislation compliments the work that is already underway in Halton. Our ability to make sure that cigarettes are not sold to minors has been strengthened. Our work with youth to help them make decisions about tobacco has been enhanced. Our efforts to help those who want to quit smoking have increased, and our ability to ensure that residents are protected from second-hand smoke in public places and work places has been improved.
