"I'm just really happy to be here," she said from her office in Town Hall Victoria Park. "I have the advantage of having worked here for a number of years."



As the deputy treasurer, she held responsibilities regarding things like property taxation, accounting and the Town's annual budgets experience that's helped her transition into her new role.
