



CONSTRUCTION **ROAD IMPROVEMENTS** TOWN OF MILTON

The Planning and Public Works Committee for the Regional Municipality of Halton proposes at its meeting on Wednesday, June 14, 2006 at 9:30 a.m. to recommend to Regional Council at its meeting of Wednesday, June 21, 2006 at 9:30 a.m. to pass a By-law for the construction of the north leg of a new intersection, to be located 770m west of Bronte Street, on Derry Road and a right-in/right-out access 110 m west of the new intersection, in the Town of Milton.

NAVIGABLE WATERS PROTECTION ACT R.S.C. 1985, CHAPTER N-22

The Regional Municipality of Halton, Ontario hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport pursuant to the Navigable Waters Protection Act for Approval of the work described herein and its site and plans. Pursuant to section 9 of the said Act, the Regional Municipality of Halton, Ontario has deposited with the Minister of Transport, and in the office of the District Registrar of the Land Registry District of Halton in the Town Milton, Regionally Municipality of Halton, Ontario, under deposit number No. G-58, a description of the following work, its site and plans:

The proposed replacement of the Derry Road (Regional Road 7) Middle Sixteen Mile Creek Bridge (West Bridge). The work will take place at Derry Road (Regional Road 7) in the Town of Milton, from 50 m east of Sixth Line to 350 m east of Sixth Line, between Lots 10 and 11, Concession 6 & 7, Trafalgar.

And under deposit number No. G-59, a description of the following work, its site and plans:

The proposed replacement of the Derry Road (Regional Road 7) East Sixteen Mile Creek Bridge (East Bridge). The work will take place at Derry Road (Regional Road 7) in the Town of Milton, from 750 m east of Sixth Line to 850 m east of Sixth Line, between Lots 10 and 11, Concession 7, Trafalgar.

Comments regarding the effect of this work on marine navigation may be directed to: The Superintendent, Navigable Waters Protection Program, Transport Canada, 100 Front Street S, Sarnia, Ontario N7T 2M4. However, comments will be considered only if they are in writing, are received not later than 30 days after the date of publication of this notice. Although all comments conforming to the above will be considered, no individual response will be sent.
