Car wash broken into

Halton Regional Police are investigating a break-in at a local carwash.

Around midnight June 16, a man smashed out the window of First Choice Car Wash, 521 Derry Rd., and stole coins from the office.

The suspect was seen fleeing the area and is described as white, in his late teens, five-foot-10 with a thin build. He was wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and jeans.

Man charged in cabbie assault

A taxi driver was assaulted after an argument broke out over his driving Tuesday night.

Police said the driver, a 39-year-old Mississauga man, drove a passenger to his home just after 10:30 p.m.

The passenger voiced his opinions about the ride and a verbal altercation followed. The driver was then punched in the neck.

A 24-year-old McNair Circle man has been charged with assault and breach of probation.

Purse snatching denied

A 62-year-old woman was frightened Saturday afternoon when a group of young teens tried to take her purse — twice.

Police said the woman was walking on Derry Road near Thompson Road at about 2:15 p.m. when three young teens approached her on their bicycles. One of the boys tried to grab her purse from her shoulder, but the woman held on to it tightly and the group fled, police said.

A few minutes later, one of the boys returned and again tried to take her purse. She still wouldn't let him have it, and he took off heading eastbound on a pathway off Derry Road. He was last seen turning north onto Thompson Road.

Several nearby people called police. A search was conducted, but nobody was found. Police are looking for three boys around 13 years old with average builds. Two of them are white with short blond hair. One is black with short dark hair.

Construction vehicle stolen

A forklift-type vehicle was stolen from Costigan Road overnight June 22.

Police said the orange 2005 Bobcat loader was stolen by unknown suspects from a construction site where a new school is being built. The value of the vehicle is \$45,000.

Construction site vandalized

Unknown suspects wreaked havoc upon a construction site sometime last weekend.

Sometime between 3:30 p.m. Saturday and 5:30 a.m. Monday, suspects trespassed onto a construction site on Derry Road owned by Milton Trails Building Development.

They kicked in two doors to gain access to an unfinished building and broke windows to 11 construction vehicles to the tune of at least \$10,000. A generator valued at \$4,000 was stolen, and a motorcycle was driven inside the building, damaging the floor. Damage to the doors was valued at \$500.

Forklift stolen

An open warehouse proved too tempting for an unknown suspect who stole a forklift June 15.

Police said the 1996 Yale forklift, which is yellow, was stolen from an Esquesing Line warehouse at around 2 p.m.

The forklift is valued at about \$8,000.

Bear frightens campers

A pair of campers had the

fright of a lifetime when they came face to face with a bear at an area campground last week.

Police said two campers were in a tent at the KOA campsite on Second Line at about 10:30 p.m. when a bear approached the tent, had a look and left.

It's not known if this is the same bear that was spotted in Nassagaweya earlier this month.

The Ministry of Natural Resources has been notified.

Window smashed

A bag of garbage was thrown through the window of Cypress Intimate Apparel on Main Street early Sunday morning.

Police said an unknown suspect threw the bag at about 4:30 a.m., which smashed the window and knocked over a mannequin, causing \$1,200 in damage. The suspect fled when the alarm sounded.

Conscience gets to teens

Two Milton teens turned themselves in to police June 16 and confessed to stealing a dozen alcoholic drinks from an open garage.

Police said a dozen coolers valued at \$25 had been stolen June 3 from a fridge in a Meighen Way garage at about 10 p.m. The garage door had been left open.

The owners didn't know the drinks had been stolen.

The teens, both 16, showed up at the Milton police station and admitted to break and enter and theft. They were referred to the Halton Regional Police's youth diversion program. No charges were laid.
