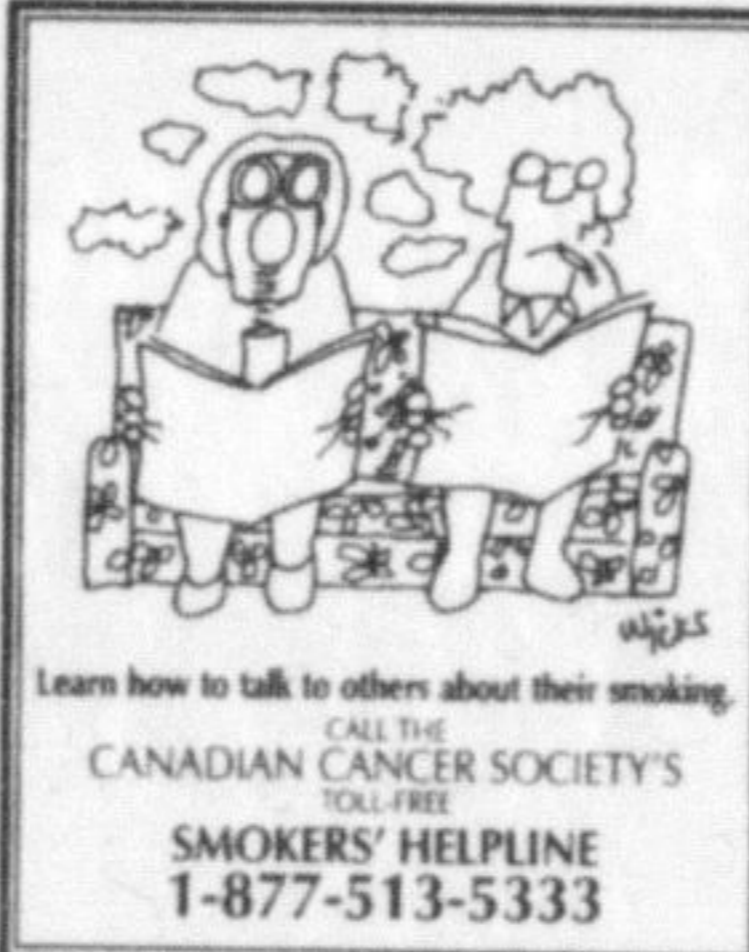

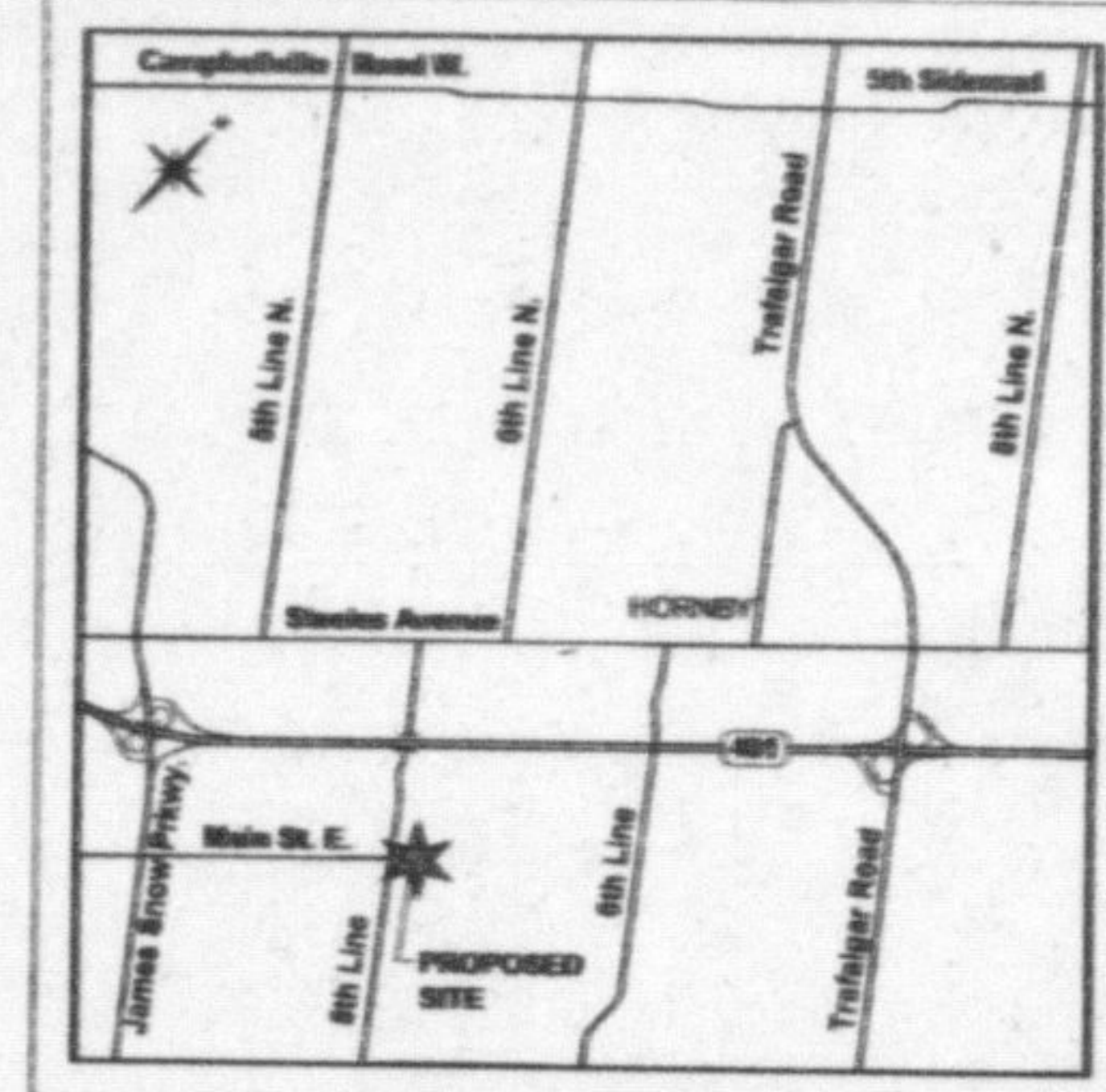

Notice of Study Commencement and Public Meeting Environmental Screening of The Milton Clean Energy Centre

Pristine Power Inc., a leading developer of power projects in Canada, has commenced an environmental assessment for the Milton Clean Energy Centre, located in the Regional Municipality of Halton, Ontario. The location of the project is identified on the map in this notice. The proposed facility would be located on lands designated as "Industrial Park Area" by the Town of Milton in their Official Plan.

The Milton Clean Energy Centre is being proposed in response to the GTA West Trafalgar RFP administered by the Ontario Power Authority (OPA) at the direction of the Ministry of Energy. This RFP requires new generation to be located at prescribed grid locations in the Region of Halton.



If environmental approvals, permits and licenses are granted and the project is awarded a Power Purchase Agreement from the OPA, a 680-megawatt (upper limit) natural gas-fired, combined-cycle facility would be constructed. The Milton Clean Energy Centre would feature technological advances that have made natural gas-fired facilities among the most environmentally friendly modes of generating electricity.

In parallel with the bid process, the Project is subject to the Environmental Screening Process for electricity projects as outlined in the Ontario Ministry of the Environment's "Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Electricity Projects" (March 2001). This notice has been issued to inform the public and other stakeholders that Pristine Power has commenced the EA study.

Open House Meeting

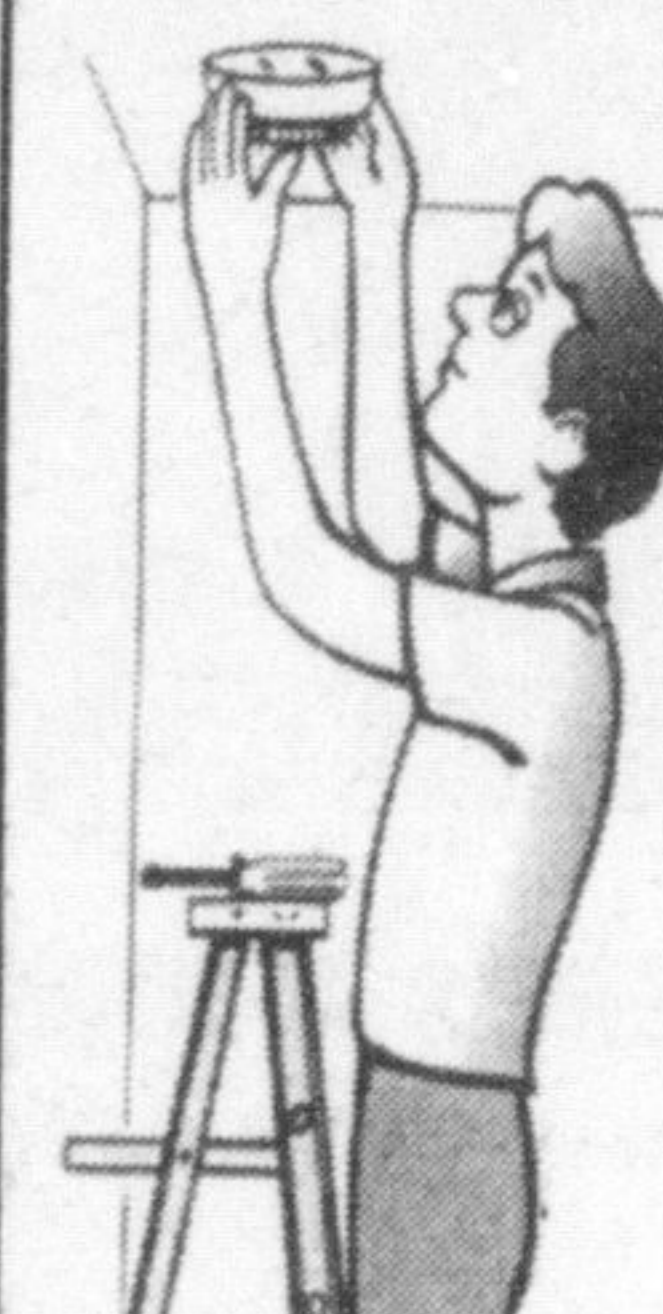
