## Release from 'Hawks upsetting: Anderson

Seasoned coach handed his walking papers once again

Getting the axe isn't exactly unfamiliar territory for Jay Anderson.


But being let go before even coaching his first game — well that's a new

That's essentially what happened to the seasoned Provincial Jr. A League coach this week, as Rick Heinz's takeover of the Milton IceHawks brought a premature end to his tenure as the team's head coach.

Hired back in April by then owner Mario Forgione after cutting ties with the neighbouring Raiders, 38-year-old Anderson of Georgetown simply didn't fit into the team's new plans - according to Heinz.

Receiving official word on his Brown — who up until recently had been overseeing operations for both the IceHawks and then affiliate Mississauga IceDogs — Anderson didn't try to mask his disappointment.

"This was the second time I was suppose to be Milton's head coach and wasn't," he said, referring to what he called a tentative agreement to take over as

bench boss of the 2003/04 IceHawks - before George Dupont brought on board. "It's frustrating."

Making news even tougher to swallow for Anderson is the fact that he and assistant coach Pat

Cocklin — now gone as well — had undergone an intense two months of recruiting and had commitments from a number of standout Jr. B players.

Those deals are now null and void. "We'd done so much work and were confident about maintaining what Milton hockey fans had come to expect - which is a high level of competitiveness," said Anderson, who had half-adozen different stints behind the Raiders' bench and was an assistant with Milton in both 1995-96 and 2003. "I think the smart thing to do at this late a date, especially with no players release Tuesday afternoon from David coming back, would have been to keep us around for a year. But it's his (Heinz's) team and his prerogative on how he wants to run it. I'm sure he's got a plan."

> The just-released coach seemed doubtful that another offer will present itself before the 2006/07 season begins, and added quite vehemently that he's "not going back to being an assistant."
