Marauders squeak by Toronto Raiders

Clutch field goal gives Milton win

There was no way the Marauders were settling for 10 points for a fourth consecutive game.

Tied 10-10 with time running out against the Toronto Raiders Saturday afternoon at Milton District High

School, Milton had one last chance to break the spell. And that's exactly what they did, scoring on a Domenic Camastro 12-yard field goal with just eight seconds remaining to prevail and improve to 3-1 in the process.

Things didn't start so well for the Marauders. On their first possession, after three incomplete passes, Ricky Clarke of the Raiders stunned Milton by returning a punt 85 yards for a touchdown. On the Marauders' next possession, they scrapped the pass and started pounding the ball. Jon Nedeljkovic initiated the drive by banging out six, seven and eight-yard gains, and was relieved by George Baiden, who did the same. Nedeljkovic topped it off just before the end of the first quarter by taking it in the remaining yard. The extra point was missed.

Camastro later got the single point back on a punt through the end-zone, but for the rest of the first half, the Milton defense ended each Raider possession early. Mike Bartello picked off a pass, Cyrus Sadeghian picked up a fumble, Listen Bates recovered another fumble forced by Kojo Millington's second sack of the half and Wayne Sliwinski recovered yet another loose ball. Camastro made good on the last undefeated Hawkeyes.

turnover by kicking a 17-yard field goal just before half-time.

Most of the second half both teams were forced to punt, except for a 27yard field goal by Toronto to even things up in the fourth quarter, and until the Marauders' final drive.

Milton started on the midfield line and displayed determination every step of the way. Nate Smith caught two key passes while on the ground from quarterback Neil Barthazaar, Chad Kennedy banged out some tough yardage, and

The Raiders made one last ditch attempt with seconds remaining on the clock — a long pass that went off Jason Nunez's hands, off

the helmet of Jimmy Singh and into the waiting arms of Jim Harper.

The game featured the return of several ex-Marauders, including standout running back Steve Lubin, who rushed for 70 yards on 17 carries, despite injuring his ankle in the second quarter. Most of his runs were greeted with some extra hard welcome home messages by former teammates.

"I had the bull's-eye — they were coming after me, and I was coming after them," laughed Lubin, who admitted to mixed feelings playing his old team in his hometown. He fondly recalled his days as a Marauder from the time they went from a losing squad to the national championship.

Lubin, the MVP in the 2004 NFC championship game, left the Marauders this season for the Raiders, mostly because he wanted to play more. "I had to prove I was a good back in this league. It wasn't something I wanted to do, but something I had to do. I love football, I just want to play."

The 3-1 Marauders play a make-up game in Oshawa Monday against the

place later this month.


That half-decade era included two Western


