On the Wing

The gentle grace of the butterfly flitting through the garden has often captured the heart of young old. Gardening to attract these gentle creatures has become a popular trend.

Butterflies often appear to be just passing through, occasionally stopping for a drink of nectar but you can prolong the stay of these colourful visitors and draw in others by providing the food and shelter they need. Food for an adult butterfly usually consists of sweet liquids, such as nectar from flowers that provide energy.

When planning a butterfly garden, create a large patch of each flower species you choose to attract and retain the butterflies. Choose some plants with larger flat-top flowers to create landing areas. Some great varieties to look for are Coreopsis, Yarrow, Delphinium, Butterfly Bush, and Butterfly Weed.

Remember to use insecticides sparingly in your butterfly gardens as most are not compatible with the guests you are working so hard to invite. Create a little summer magic of your own and invite our winged friends to visit your backyard this year.

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
