Two men are being sought after PoliceBlotter

credit card to purchase baby merchandise and attempting to use it at another store Tuesday.

Police said a man, accompanied by another adult male, bought items for a baby totaling \$756 from Zellers at Milton Mall with what appeared to be a Visa card.

They then went to the LCBO store on Main Street and attempted to buy Scotch whiskey. The cashier suspected the card was fraudulent and went to get it verified, at which point the suspects fled.

They drove away in a dark blue or black four-door Honda Accord and were last seen heading southbound on Bronte Street at a high speed.

It was determined the card had, in fact, been duplicated. The first suspect is described as south Asian, in his early twenties, five-foot-four to five-foot-six, with a goatee. He was wearing a white, green, blue and yellow golf shirt and dark pants.

The second suspect is in his thirties and heavy set, and was wearing a Hawaiian-type shirt.

Police are continuing to investigate. Anyone who witnessed the incident is asked to call the Milton police station's fraud bureau at (905) 878-5511, ext. 2419.

Merchandise shoplifted

Police believe the same men were involved in a similar incident an hour earlier in a York region Loblaws. The same vehicle was used.


Vehicle broken into

Theft spree at Hydro One

Halton Regional Police are asking for the public's help to identify the people responsible for a rash of thefts from Hydro One.

The series of thefts from the site, located at 1260 Main St., began in August of last year with suspects forcing their way into a storage area and stealing \$10,000 worth of equipment including two Honda ATVs.

A second theft, later that same month, netted thieves a variety of power tools valued at \$12,000.

Over the past three months, thieves have targeted the site on three separate occasions stealing an estimated \$50,000 worth of aluminum material, consisting of aluminum/steel conduit wire. In the latest two incidents, the suspects left behind the oxy-acetylene tanks and torches used to cut the wire into easily transportable lengths.
