Dimitrov dynamite at junior provincials

Amasses six medals to lead the Marlins

David Dimitrov had a lot more to pack up than just his swim suit and goggles after his trip to the nation's capital.

The 14-year-old Milton Marlin recently returned from the Ontario Junior Long Course Championships in Ottawa with six medals — four of the golden variety — and the award for top male swimmer in his age group.

Building on his efforts at this spring's divisionals, the local teen turned back all challengers in the 400 and 1,500m freestyle, and was also tops in both the 200 and 400m individual medley. He set new meet records in all but the 1,500m free, and rounded out his weekend with silver-medal performances in the 200 and 800m free.

Dimitrov's hefty haul allowed the Marlins to place 17th out of more than 80 teams at the junior provincials. That's a mighty respectable finish, given that Milton is now competing against many clubs with far more members, having just recently — and barely — surpassed the 50-swimmers-or-less barrier needed to remain in the smaller team loop.

The Marlins secured two other

medals in Ottawa.

Brent Burke, 13, struck silver in the 50m free — highlighting a weekend that included two fifths in the 100 and 200m free, a sixth in the 100m breaststroke and an eighth in the 400m free.

Turning 11 just two days before the competition, Ioana-Maria Negru — arguably the most promising young Marlin in recent years — claimed bronze in the 200m free. She also finished fifth in the 800m free and seventh in the 200m IM.



Four other Miltonians contributed to the team's

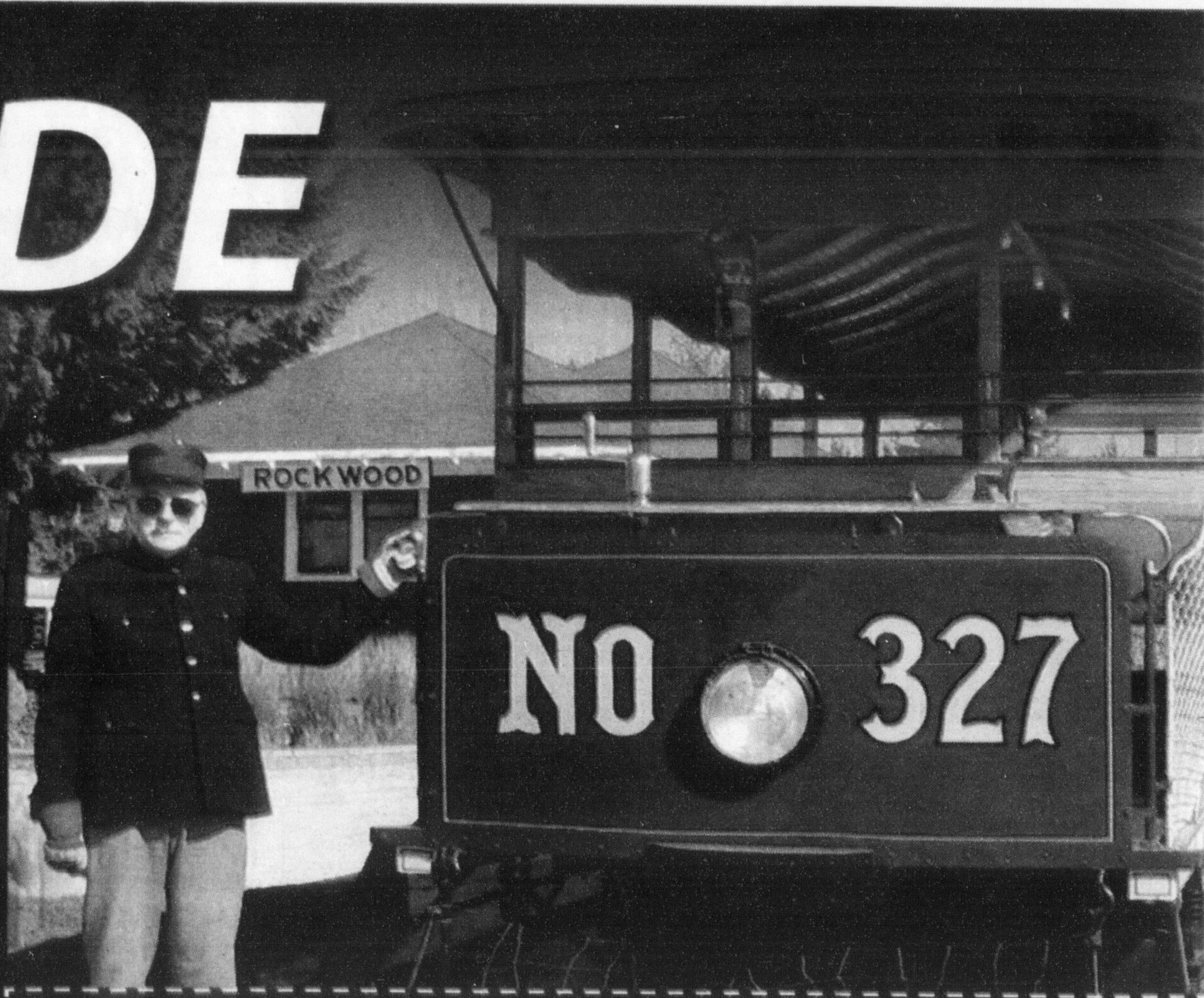
point total, including 10-year-old Nadiya Safonova, who was fourth in the 200m IM, fifth in both the 50m butterfly and 400m free, sixth in the 200m backstroke and seventh in the 200m freestyle.

Alex Davis, 14, swam to fifth-place honours in the 100m free and eighth-place honours in the 100m breaststroke. Fifteen-year-old Will Wright was sixth in the 50 and 100m free and seventh in the 100m fly, while placing sixth in the 50m free and both the 100 and 200m breaststroke was 14-year-old Paul Zielinski. The Marlins' 14-15-year-old boys team also delivered an impressive fifth-place showing in the 4x100m freestyle relay.

Dimitrov will lead a small Marlin contingent this weekend at the inaugural junior nationals in Calgary.
