There'll be a new face around Mountsberg Conservation Area over the next few months as it launches its artist-in-residency project.

Mountsberg

The project will give contemporary artists of all types the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the unique environment of Mountsberg in order to create and install new masterpieces that respond to the area.

Artists selected for the project will be invited to create works that use natural materials and items that are either found at Mountsberg, are readily available native materials or are related materials that speak to Mountsberg's landscape.

The use of soil, branches, wood, leaves, organic matter, stones or even water are possibilities.

Some resulting works will be temporary, while others may be permanent.

This year's artist is Hamilton-based Simon Frank, who will work with Mountsberg until October.

He was selected for the position based on his body of work and his interest in creating art that explores the social responsibility of those who live in an urban industrialized environ-

The natural environment will provide the materials and inspiration for Frank's investigation of the relationship between nature and culture.

Frank uses a wide range of approaches in his art, including sculpture and installation, performance, photography and video.

The project is funded by the Ontario Arts Council.
