

Housing plan approved by town council

The Town has thrown its support, in principle, behind the Region's recentlycreated Comprehensive Strategy.

A motion to that effect put forward by Ward 4 Councillor Wendy Schau was passed by council last Tuesday.

The strategy is designed to address Halton's housing needs until 2015 and beyond and contains five major strategic directions — promoting healthy communities, encouraging and protecting affordable housing, encouraging and protecting assisted housing, supporting independent living and retaining and regaining housing — and 40 specific recommendations for action.

While the majority of council members supported Schau's motion, fellow Ward 4 Councillor John Challinor said he couldn't endorse it.

He said he thinks it's dangerous to lend support to something that may have implications on the regional tax base "without knowing what they are."

But Schau argued that her motion simply means the Town supports the overall principle behind the strategy, not "every little thing."

She said she understands Challinor's concerns when it comes to financial ramifications.

"There probably will be (some financial impact), but something needs to be done," Schau said. "It is our responsibility to do what we can to provide a continuum of housing in Milton for the people of Milton."

She pointed out that the Region didn't just create the strategy and present it to the Town, but rather the Town was involved in developing it.

"I think that means we need to support it," she said.

Local resident Karl Reichert also spoke at the meeting and voiced his support for the strategy and for the Town "to act on the provision of affordable housing in Milton."


