More mosquitoes found carrying West Nile in Milton

Risk to humans increasing, says Region

Additional mosquitoes trapped in Milton have tested positive for West Nile virus The most recent testing (WNV), meaning a greater chance of humans becoming infected.

Last week, nine batches trapped by the Halton health department tested positive for the virus. One of these batches was from Milton, six were from Oakville and two were from Georgetown.

positive in Milton since 2003 were trapped August 2.

means WNV has been detected in all four Halton municipalities. WNV-infected birds have also been found in Burlington and Oakville.

This year so far, no human cases of WNV have been detected in Halton, but the risk is increasing.

"The virus is going to contin-The first mosquitoes to test ue to build in the mosquito

population until the end of the season," said Halton Medical Officer of Health Dr. Bob Nosal.

"Therefore, the likelihood of mosquitoes passing on the virus to humans is increasing."

The highest risk period for WNV is from now until late September. The risk of serious illness from WNV increases with age. The health department is advising residents, especially older adults and the elderly, to protect themselves against mosquito bites to reduce the risk of becoming infected.

Position summary Interested in being a School Crossing Guard?

School Crossing Guards are wonderful citizens who are responsible for safely crossing our children at intersections near schools in the Town of Milton. Our Crossing Guards are reliable and responsible men and women who interact well with children and are committed to their safety.

Crossing Guards must be available for a minimum of half an hour in the morning before school and a half hour after school, five days a week for the entire school year. These are paid part time positions starting at \$12.23/hour. Applicants must successfully pass a police security check prior to employment and must be capable of standing outside for long periods in all weather conditions. Crossing Guards must be 18 years of age or older. No experience is necessary as all training is provided. Crossing Guards must be pleasant, courteous and helpful towards all members of the public at all times. All weekends and school holidays are off, which makes this an ideal job for retired persons or those wanting part time hours. Parents, grandparents, retirees, neighbours and friends all make great Crossing Guards.

What do Crossing Guards do?

- · Create safe gaps in traffic to enable children and others to cross safely
- · Report licence numbers of cars who drive in an unsafe manner, or who fail to stop for and obey the Crossing Guard
- · Report children who fail to listen to the direction of the Crossing Guard and who are acting in an unsafe manner
