He asked if her boss was there, police said, to which she responded he wasn't. He told her he was employed with an electricity company and engaged her in conversation.

He then put his hand down the front of her shirt.

Police said the victim grabbed the man's hand and held him in a wristlock. He was forced to leave the store on his hands and knees, police said.

A 40-year-old Brampton man was arrested and charged with sexual assault.

Alchin faces a charge of criminal negligence causing death as well as charges of failing to remain and drug possession.

He was released on bail last month and is residing in Georgetown with his mother.

Lauren Cooper, a student at Milton District High School, was rollerblading the night of July 13 on Second Line, just north of No. 15 Sideroad when she was struck by a vehicle. She was later pronounced dead at Milton District Hospital.
