

# Honda dealership on the way?

A Honda dealership could soon be driving into town.

The business has been proposed for the southwest corner of Steeles Avenue and Martin Street, but in order for it to go ahead, the Town would have to approve a zoning amendment for the property.

A public meeting on the proposal will be held August 28 during council's regular meet-

ing starting at 7:30 p.m. in Milton Council Chambers at Town Hall Victoria Park.

Another public meeting will be held that night regarding a proposed zoning amendment for an existing building on Mill Street, opposite Garden Lane.

The owner would like office, financial office and commercial school uses permitted on the ground floor of the building,

whereas the current zoning directs those types of businesses to the upper floor.

Council won't make a decision on the proposals at the meeting. Staff will bring recommendations on whether to approve or deny the applications to future meetings.

Town Hall Victoria Park is located at 43 Brown St.

# Fraud case resumes next month

A Halton Hills woman charged with defrauding three north Halton school councils of about \$30,000, including two in Milton, will return to court September 6.

Brenda Pickering, 43, was charged in February with three counts of theft over \$5,000 and uttering a forged document.

The return date was set Wednesday at Ontario Court of Justice in Milton, where the next appearance will be held.

From 2002 to 2005, Pickering served as the volunteer treasurer for the

school councils at J.M. Denyes and W.I. Dick as well as at Georgetown's Stewarttown Public School. It was during that time that the money went missing from the accounts of the three school councils.

A police investigation was initiated after a complaint by the Halton District School Board that irregularities had been discovered in the school councils' accounting practices.

About \$10,000 went missing from J.M. Denyes and about \$5,500 from W.I. Dick.

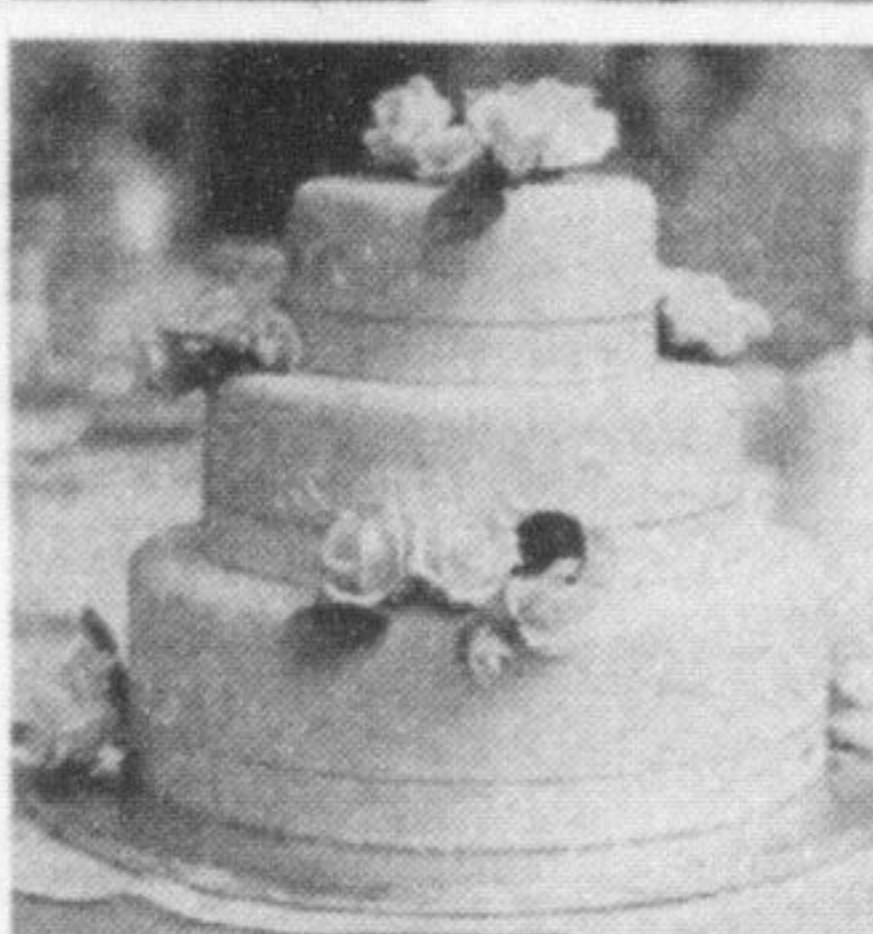
