

# Civil war re-enactment at Country Heritage Park this weekend

Country Heritage Park will become the scene of a civil war this weekend as visitors are swept back into the 1800s.

The battle lines will be drawn tomorrow and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. as the American Civil War Historical Re-enactment Society takes over the park and transforms it into year 1860.

"When (visitors) arrive, they'll travel back through time," said park manager Reg Cressman.

Each day starting at 3 p.m., a 45-minute re-enactment complete with cannons, cavalry and 200 infantry members will be held. It'll conclude with a march-off.

Throughout the day, visitors can also tour military camps and a sutler's market.

Plus, there'll be a Victorian fashion show and high tea.

"We're trying to re-create the sights, sounds and feelings of that era," Cressman said.

He explained there were many Canadians who fought on both sides of the American civil war, making it particularly appropriate for remembrance in Canada.

Since the park's exhibits will also be open, there'll be plenty for the kids to do, Cressman said, be it visit the log cabin homestead or try their hands at old-fashioned games in the schoolhouse.

Food will be available, or families can pack a picnic lunch.

The park is pet-friendly, for those who wish to bring their furry canine friends along.

The cost is \$7 for adults, \$6 for seniors and \$4 for kids aged six to 12. Younger kids are free. A family pass for three kids and two adults is available for \$20.

You can be sure your garbage and recyclables are collected by putting them curbside by 7 a.m. on collection day

To ensure your garbage and recyclables are collected, put your waste curbside by 7 a.m. the morning of your collection day, but no sooner than 5 p.m. the evening before. Collection times can vary from week to week due to route changes, weather conditions and equipment repairs.

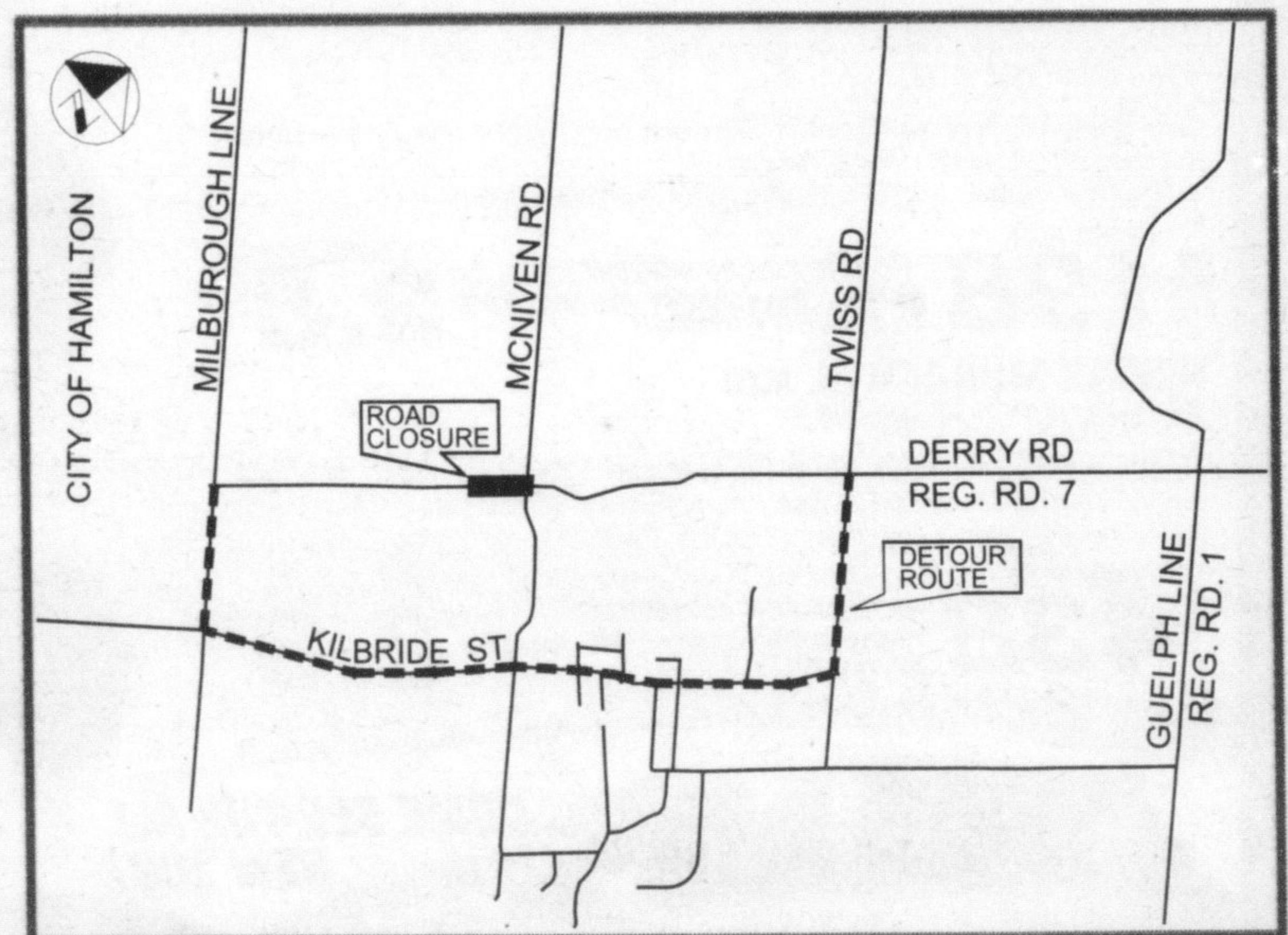
If you are concerned about animals accessing your garbage or recyclables:

- Secure garbage containers with bungee cords or weigh down with a rock or brick.
- Sprinkle strong smelling repellents (mustard oil, naphtha flakes or mothballs) around or inside garbage containers.
- Rinse out all bottles, cans, jars, etc., before placing it in your Blue Box.

Remember, collection trucks will start to pick-up your waste and recyclables at 7 a.m. on collection day.
