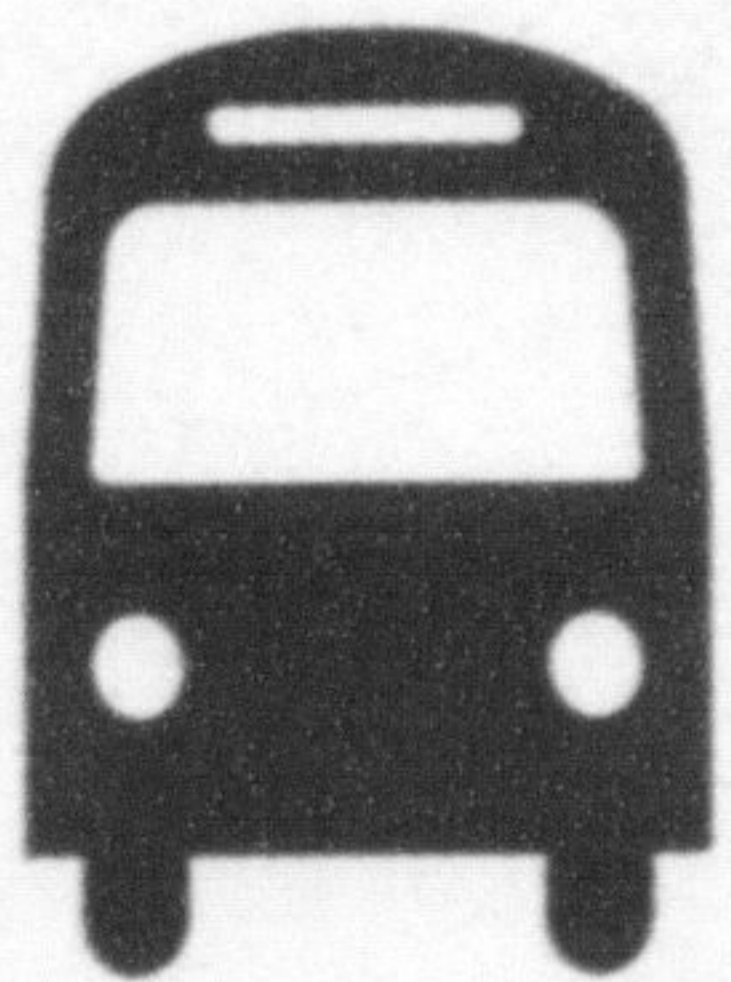

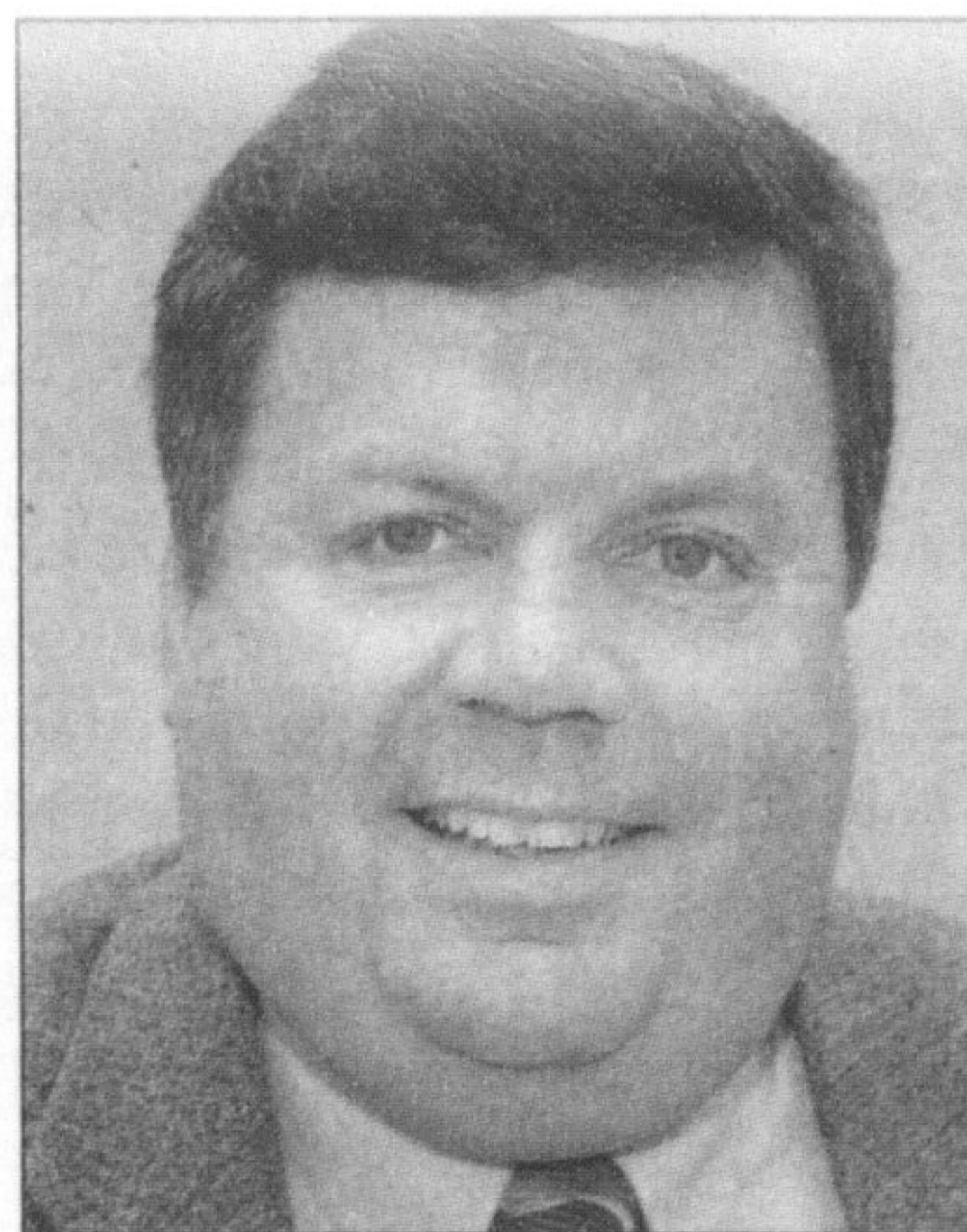
Curtis, Wilhelm to run again

As the deadline for registering to run in this fall's municipal election nears, more candidates are coming forward.

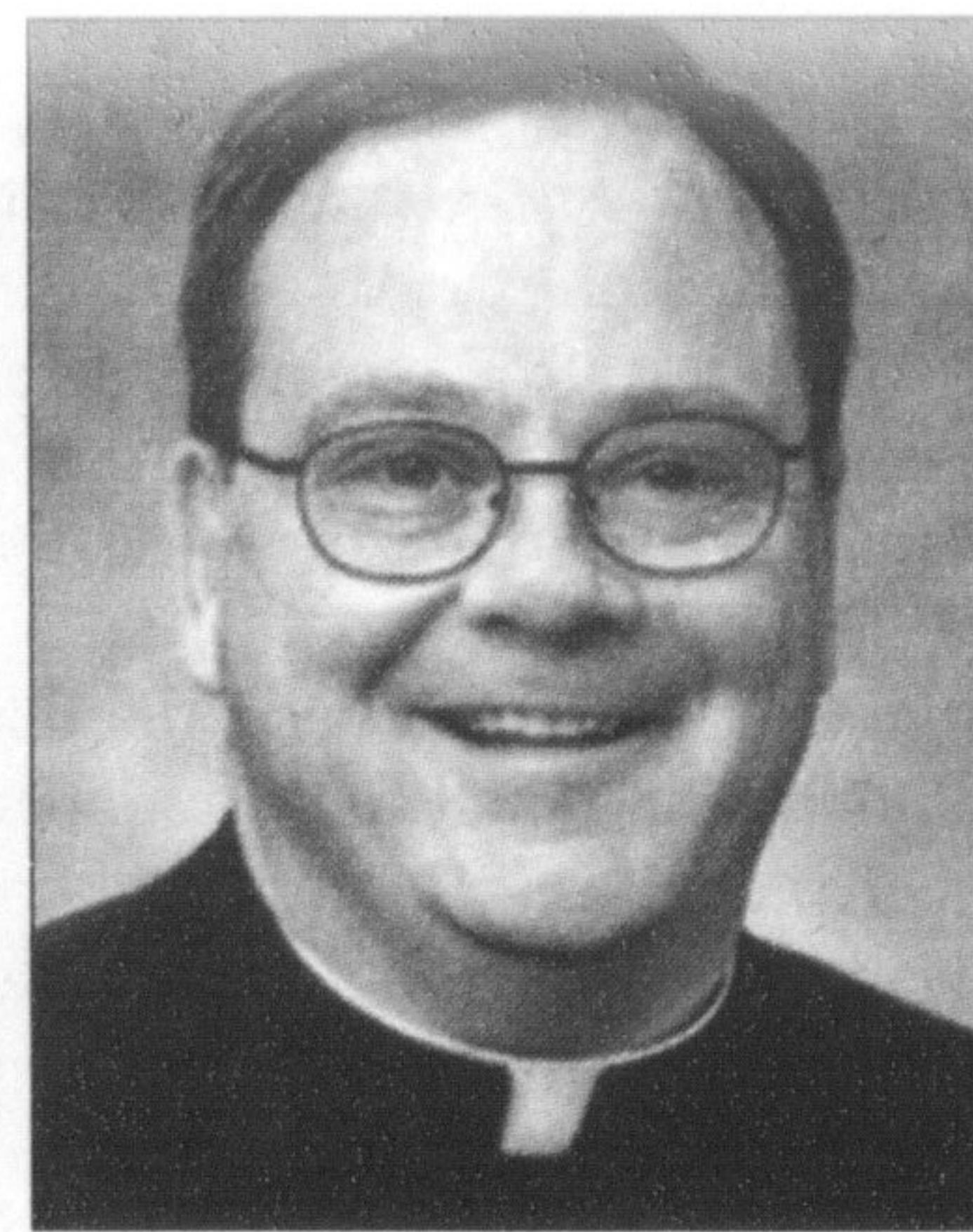
Current Ward 2 Councillor Mark Curtis threw his hat in the ring Wednesday, putting him in the race against two-time candidate Jim Timbers, fellow Ward 2 incumbent Mike Boughton and Dorland-Haight Galleries owner Peter Haight.

Curtis is better known in the community as Father Mark of Grace Anglican Church. He's currently serving his first term on council and said he thinks during the past three years he has gained the trust and respect of the community.

Burlington man registers to run against Carr for regional chair

The pool of Halton chair candidates has grown to two.

Burlington's Robert Plaschka, an electrical engineer, is the latest to throw his hat into the political ring.

He graduated from the University of Ottawa in 1990, and worked for several firms before starting his own engineering company in 1996. He moved the business and his family to Burlington a year later.

Since then, Plaschka has provided electrical and control system services to a number of businesses. He and his wife are members of the Autism Ontario, Halton chapter.

The other candidate vying for regional chair is Kilbride's Gary Carr, former Halton MP.

Current Halton Regional Chair Joyce Savoline announced earlier this year she wasn't seeking re-election.
