Mattamy will then be reimbursed, without interest, in the future when the roads projects would've normally come forward in the Town and Region budgets.

A motion, which Town Clerk Troy McHarg said may just ask staff to prepare a report on Furik's request to slow growth, is expected to come back before council later this month.

Growth slower at the moment

Figures from Town staff show that

development is actually down a bit right now compared to the same time last year.

As of mid-August, 863 new residential unit permit applications had come in, which is several hundred less than last August's 1,227 permit applications.

And on the industrial/commercial/institutional (ICI) front, construction applications made by August 15 totaled 950,000 square feet, while last year in August 1.8 million square feet worth of applications came in.

Director of Planning and Development Mel Iovio said he expects ICI growth will pick up, noting there are several large businesses coming to town.

"We're going to do well over one million (square feet)," he said.

Iovio said he also thinks residential development figures will start to get closer to those from last year. There've been some delays associated with securing water and sewer servicing for the new homes.

Town goes to Province

Council passed a motion along those lines Monday evening, throwing its support behind the original resolution from the Town of Halton Hills that asks the provincial government to examine the possibility of having Ontario farm wine at farmers' markets and the LCBO.

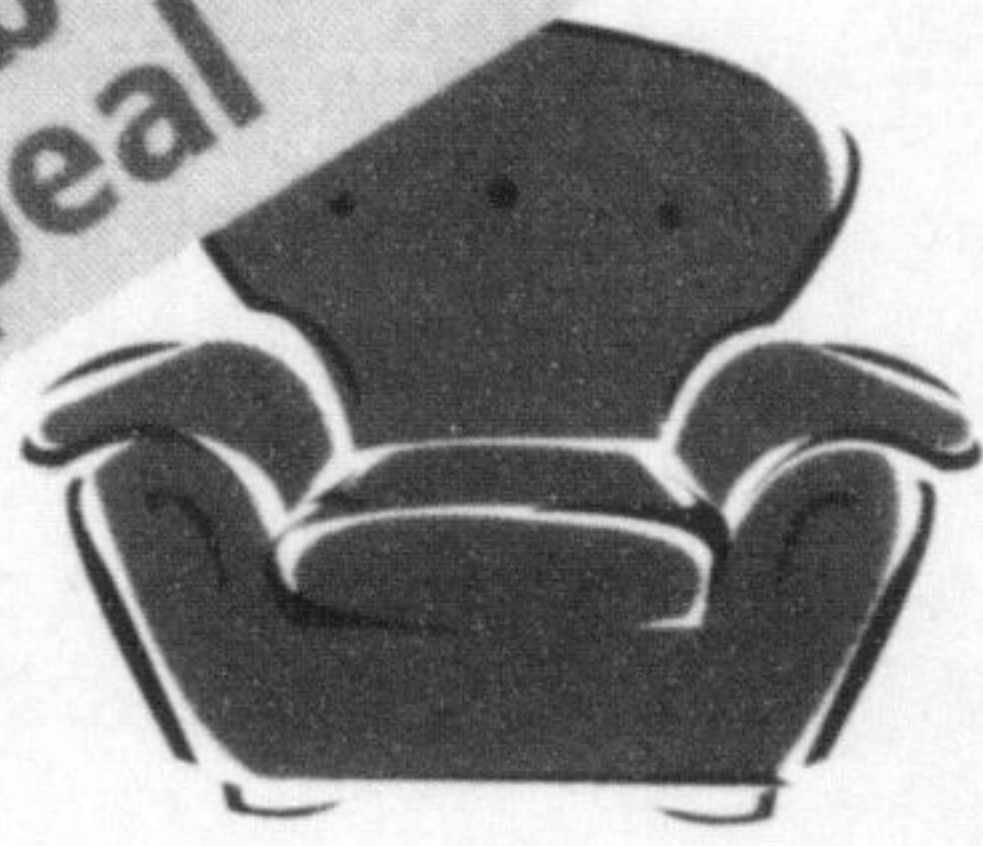
Ward 3 Councillor Jan Mowbray — who put the motion forward — pointed out that "farmers have a big enough trouble now," making it all the more important to support them.

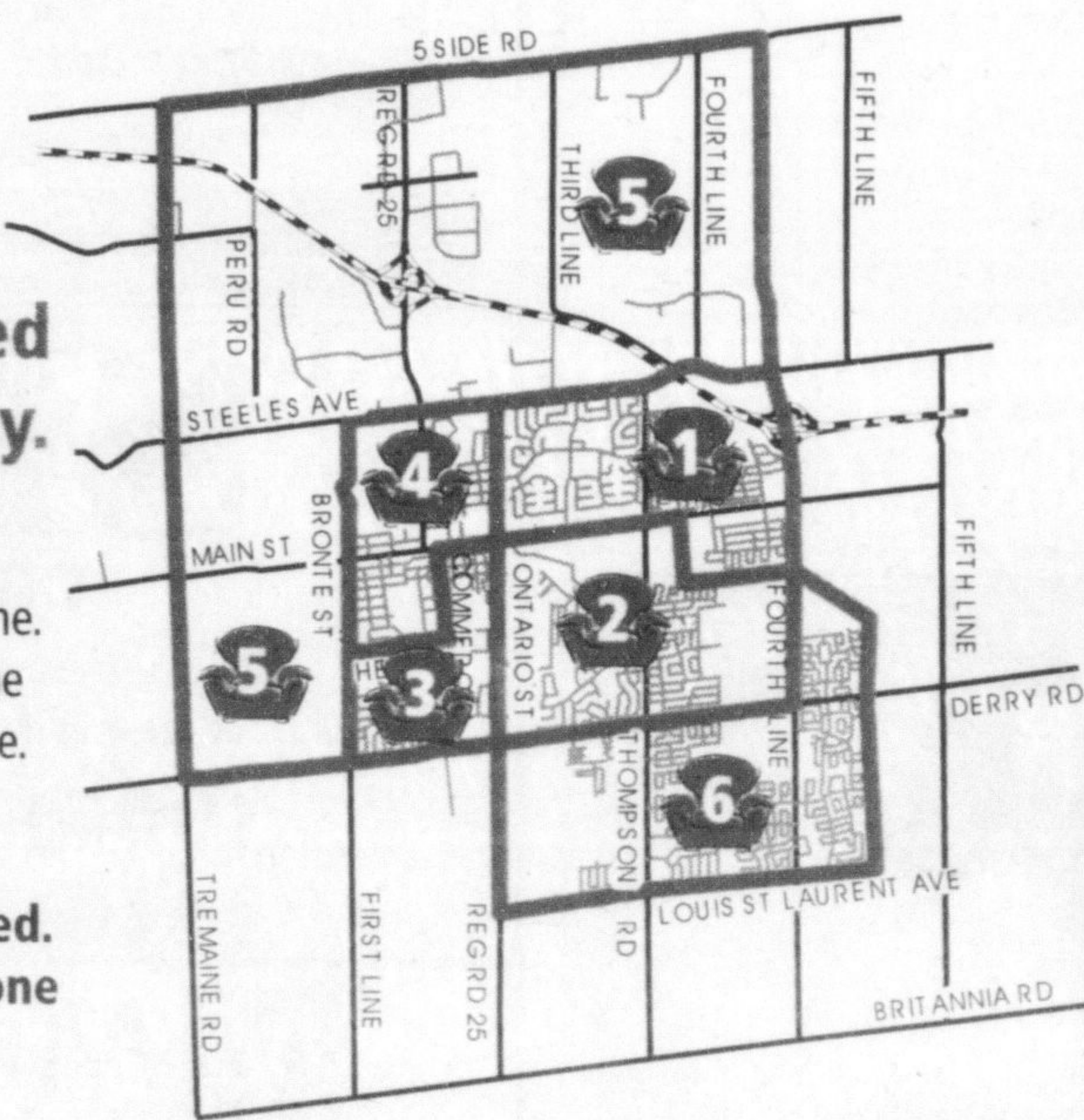


Milton Urban Bulk Collection

The following materials will NOT be collected:

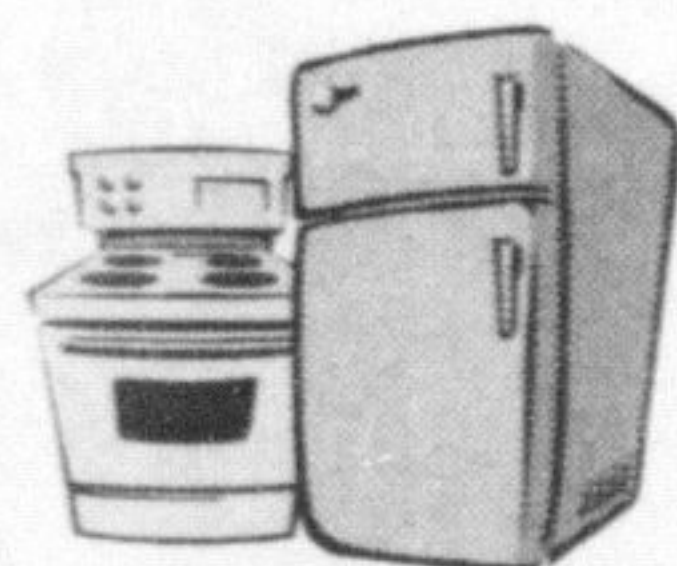
- Automobile Parts*

**Only small tree stumps under 30 cm (1 ft) in diameter can be accepted at the HWMS.
