

Hoy leads Excelsiors to Summer Games bronze


At the risk of stating the obvious, the Brampton Excelsiors are a much more potent lacrosse team with Brad Hoy in the lineup.

The 16-year-old Campbellville lacrosse player recently offered another reminder of that all-too-clear fact in Ottawa — where he powered the Excelsiors' A midget squad to bronze at the Ontario Summer Games.

Recently returning from a separated shoulder injury that sidelined him for several weeks — during which Brampton's production took a serious hit — the speedy sniper led the way with 16 points overall in the eight-team tournament.

Refusing to depart the nation's capital without a medal, Hoy fueled a hard-fought 7-5 decision over the Orangeville Northmen in the battle for bronze by scoring three times and adding an assist. His second and third goals came in the final frame, with the latter of these standing up as the game winner.

"It (winning goal) came midway through the third. I intercepted a breakout pass and basically just went in and put it in the top shelf," recalled the Excelsiors' top offensive threat, whose team went 3-3-1 in round-robin play en route to claiming bronze. "My arm was still sore, but my spirits were high

when we took home a medal."

Having lost all but one game to the Northmen this season and dropped an 8-3 decision to them in round-robin play, Brampton wasn't exactly favoured in the rematch for third place.

But if Hoy and company were suffering from a psychological disadvantage, it sure didn't reflect in their play.

"For the most part they'd had our number this year, but we were really confident for this one and just gave it our all," said the veteran Excelsior, who's earned three provincial medals over the past four seasons, including Ontario 'B' gold as a bantam in 2003.
