from a first communion dress or baby blanket.

Hedi Nowak of the Harrop Art Gallery has recently also come on board, doing custom framing — if desired — for the pieces.

"Framing is like putting on jewelry. It puts the final accentuating on any art," she said, explaining the style of frame chosen can make the art fit just about any type of décor.

MacIntyre said she gravitates to lighthearted subject matters. Some she has painted specifically for children's rooms, like one featuring a child dressed up in a knight's armor facing his foe — a dragon.

"It's happy, whimsical, fun," she said of her style.

The C2 paint line is notable for several reasons, not the least of which is its high quality, Bergsma said.

The company offers large paint chips (18 by 24 inches) with actual eggshell finish paint on them so shoppers can

know exactly what they're getting, she said.

"I find that they (C2) have offered an excellent selection of colours both in a neutral palette as well as the deeper, richer colours for those clients not afraid to be saturated with colour complexity," Bergsma said.

Support from the community has already been overwhelming, MacIntyre said.

"There's a magic here that lets us do this sort of thing."
