A full environmental assessment means carefully examining social, economic and natural land effects of the highway. It also means seriously studying alternatives, such as widening existing highways or creating superior rail and public transit systems.

A key factor in the transportation planning process is the forecast that the Greater Golden Horseshoe area will grow by four million people within 30 years.

"All reasonable options to add transportation capacity to the corridor will be examined

during the course of the study," said MTO spokesperson Bob Nichols.

Hudak noted some specific suggestions were presented to Cansfield "for expediting the Mid-Pen process." One of them centered on using a previous 2001 needs assessment study to accelerate Phase One of the EA process.

Phase One as currently written will re-evaluate whether a new highway is needed in the first place, whether the QEW should be expanded or if traffic can be relieved through transitonly options, Hudak stated. The 2001 needs assessment already studied these issues and determined a highway was required,

in addition to GO Transit expansion to Niagara.

"Significant time and money would be saved by using the original study rather than restudying the same issues," he stated. "(Cansfield) was well aware of Niagara's and Hamilton's concerns about timeframes and growing traffic congestion."

Kelly said a working group is in the process of being established to monitor and participate in the EA process, and is expected to start some time this year. He said all affected municipalities will be invited to take


