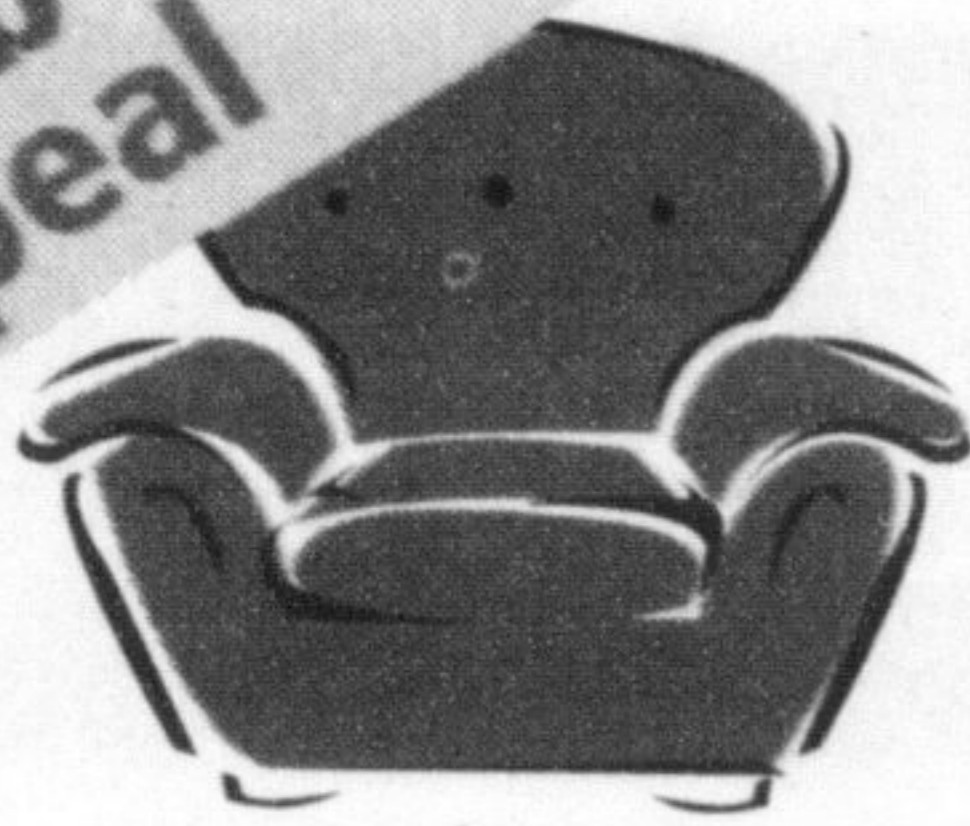

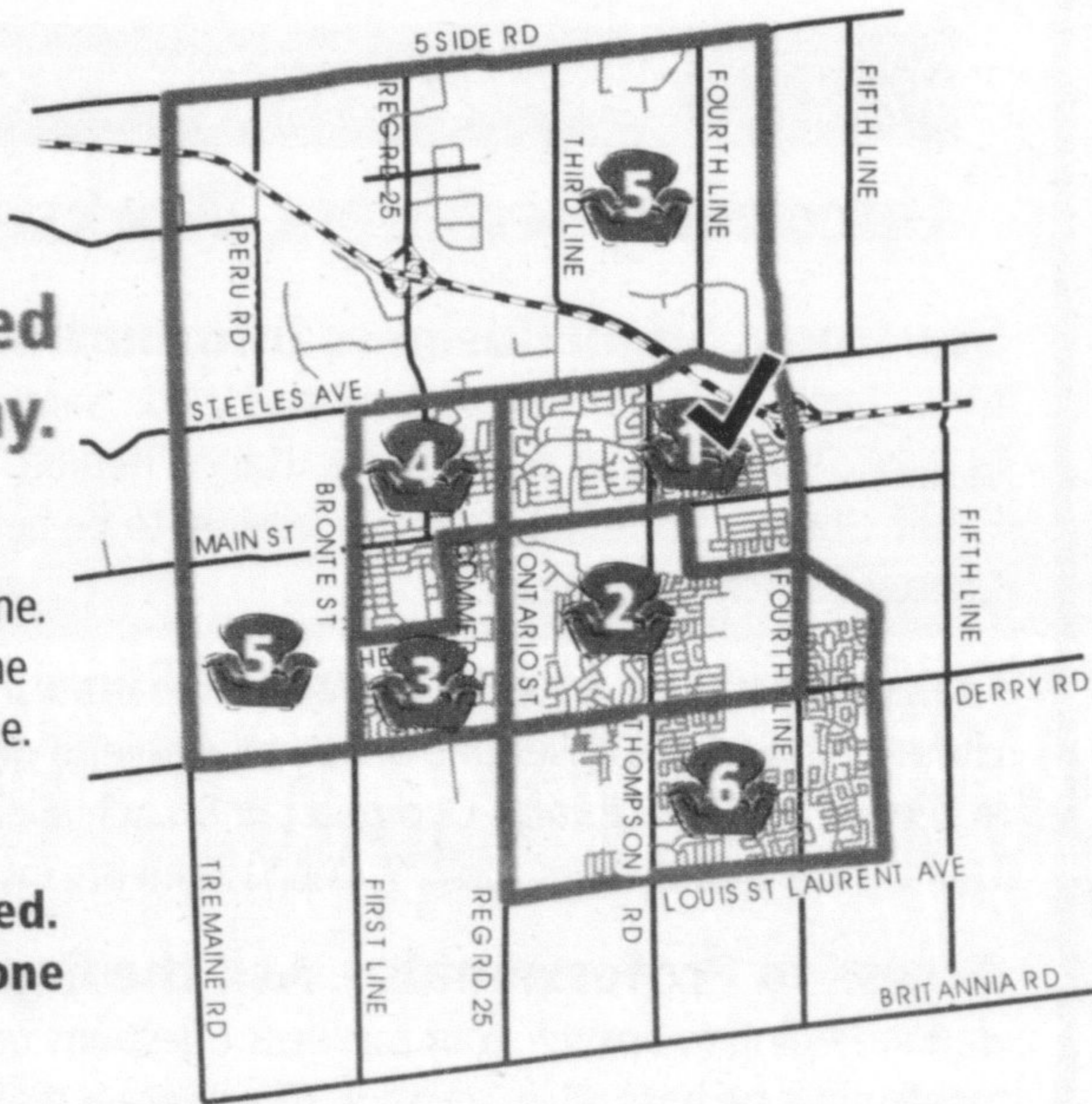


Milton Urban Bulk Collection

Place items at curb by 7:00 a.m. on your designated bulk collection day.

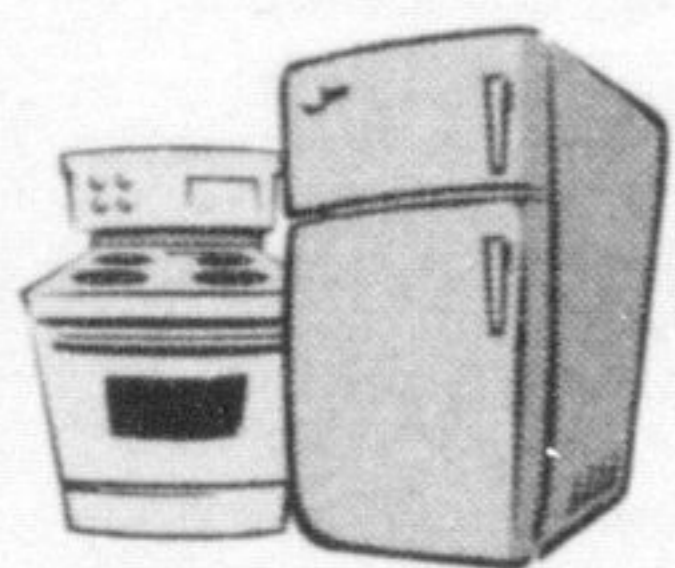
Check the map for your corresponding collection zone. Items will be collected on the day designated for your zone.

- Soil and Rocks

These items may be disposed of at Halton's Waste Management Site (HWMS), 5400 Regional Road 25, Milton. Open Monday - Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

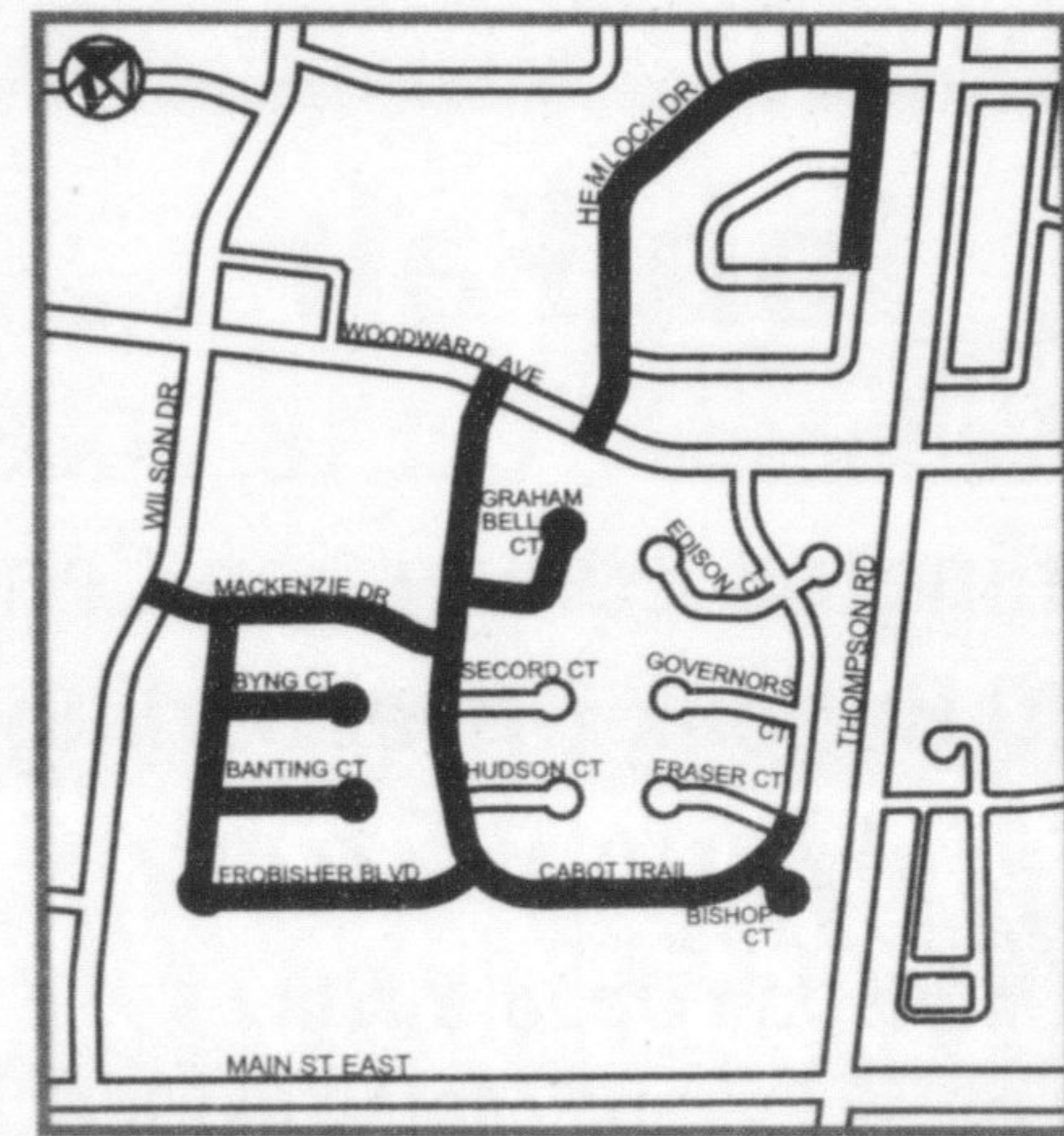
*Only small non-hazardous automobile parts can be accepted at the HWMS.

**Only small tree stumps under 30 cm (1 ft) in diameter can be accepted at the HWMS.

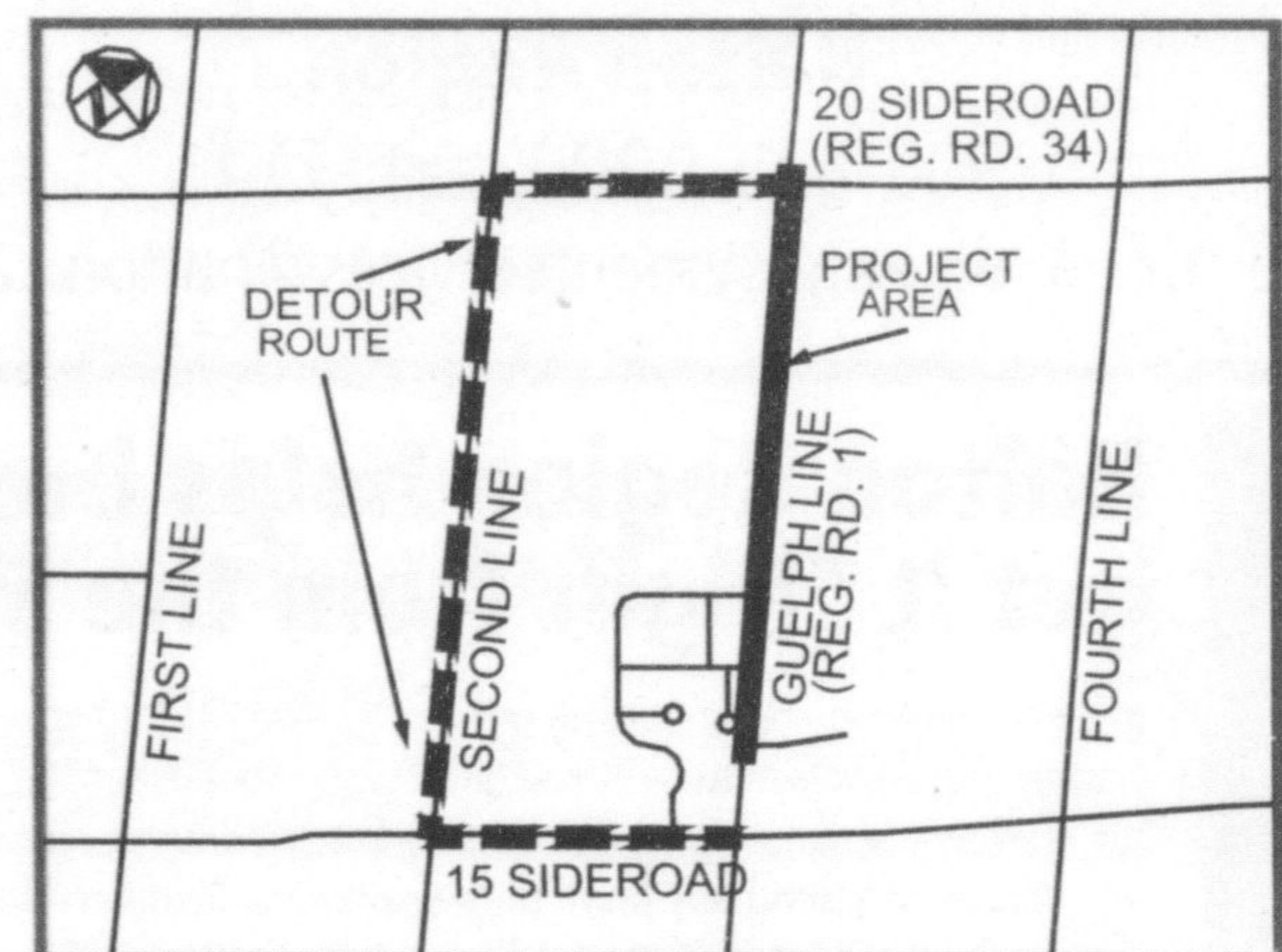
