Houses old and new featured in tour

Public can see 6 homes in St. Paul's church's public house tour

Innovative, newer homes and heritage-rich older homes will all be part of this weekend's autumn house tour.

The Best of Old and New House Tour, being put on by St. Paul's United Church, 123 Main St. E., will take place Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and will include six local homes.

Participants will be able to walk in the footsteps of P.L. Robertson, the inventor of the socket head screw, as they tour his limestone home overlooking the Mill Pond. The home was originally built in 1856 as a women's seminary, and set the stage for a visit by John A. MacDonald in 1877.

Anne Boulevard is the setting for a 1960s bungalow with an added second storey. It features a peaceful backyard garden and swimming pool.

Also on the tour are three houses by Mattamy Homes showcasing modern design.


The cost of the tour is \$15, or \$20 with a hot homemade lunch - with door prizes - included.


