The Halton District School Board will kick off its annual United Way campaign next week.

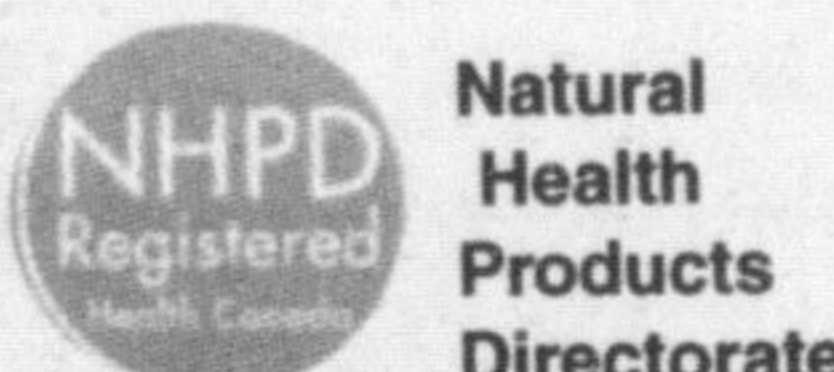
