Groups receive slots cash

Town council approved more than \$5,000 in grants for local athletes Monday night.

The money is going to 10 Miltonians to assist with the costs of traveling to sports championships. It comes from the Milton Community Fund, which was created so residents or groups can apply for money the Town receives from Slots at Mohawk.

Grants were approved for:

- The Milton Marlin Swim Team, \$2,499 for five swimmers and two coaches to support travel expenses for the Junior National Swim

Championships

- Kamil Karbonowski, \$700 for a trip to New Mexico as a member of the Canadian National Junior Fencing Team

- Jade Ryan and Allana McLeod, \$1,000 each to cover travel costs for the International Dance Organization 2006 World Championships.

Applications for the funding are reviewed by the Community Services Advisory Committee and staff.

The Community Fund now has a balance of \$204,070.

Flu clinics pushed back until mid-Nov.

The Region's flu clinics won't start until mid-November this year due to a delay in vaccine production that's affecting many Canadian communities.

The vaccination is free for all residents of Ontario who are six months old and up.

In addition to the delay affecting health department clinics, flu vaccines offered by physicians and local pharmacies will also be held up as a result of the situation.

ALTERNATE WATER SUPPLY TO THE TOWN OF MILTON CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The Study

Halton Region is initiating a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Study for an alternate water supply to the Town of Milton and the Halton Hills Highway 401 Corridor (see map). The Town of Milton water supply consists of a groundwater-based well system and a lake-based water supply from Oakville by way of a transmission main on Regional Road 25. The Halton Water and Wastewater Master Plan Review (2002) identified the need for improvements to the Town of Milton's lake-based water supply system that will address security of supply and service projected and approved growth.

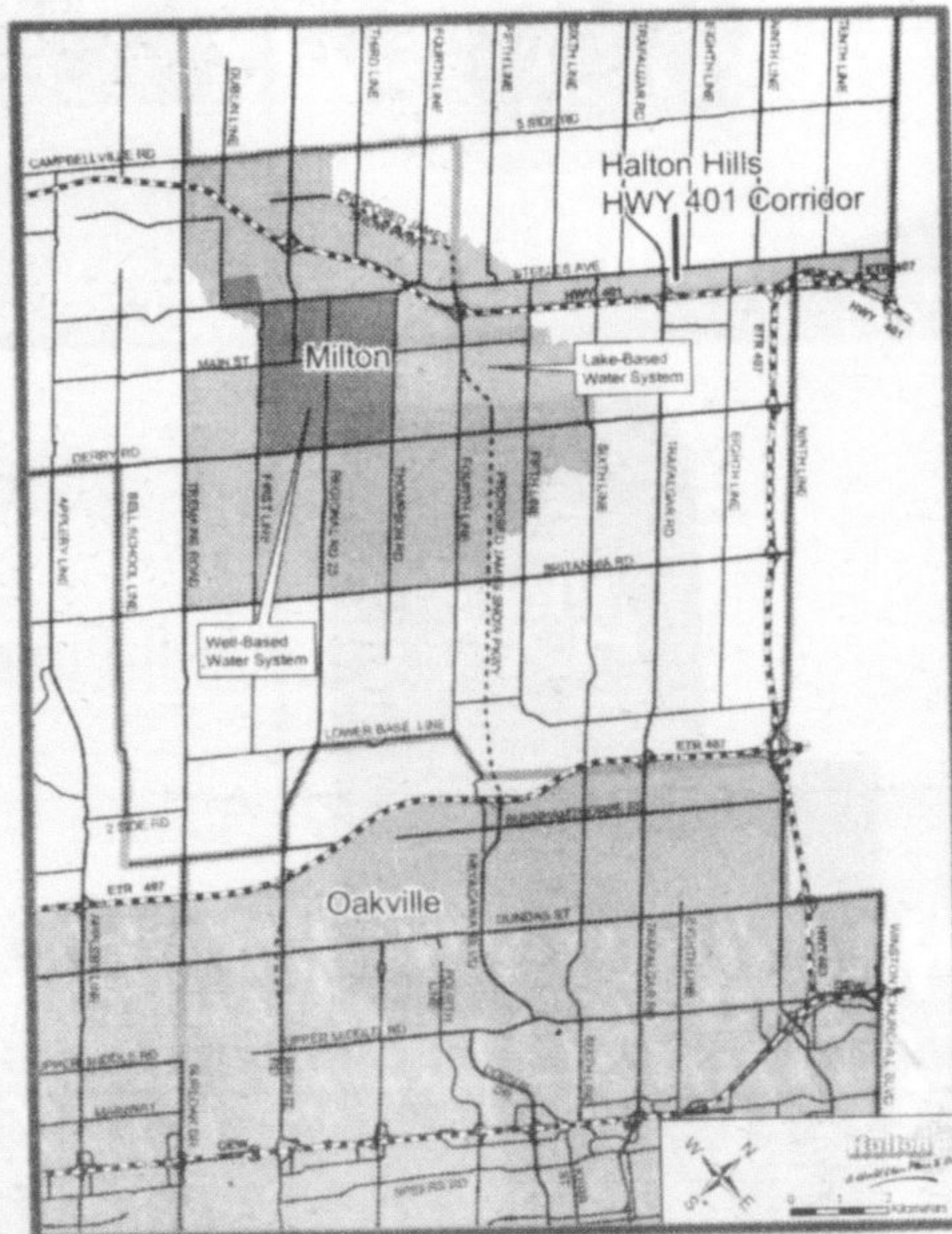


Figure 1 - Approximate Study Limits

The Process

The study is being conducted in accordance with the approved requirements of a Schedule 'B' project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000), which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The Class EA process includes public and review agency consultation, an evaluation of alternatives, an assessment of the potential environmental effects of the proposed improvements, and identification of reasonable measures to mitigate any adverse impacts that may result. The map above shows the approximate limits of the study area.

As part of the Study, a Public Information Centre is planned for early 2007 to present the project to the public and government review agencies for review and comment. The Public Information Centre will provide background information on the study and the various alternatives considered, including a comparative analysis of those alternatives. Representatives from the Region and its consultant Earth Tech will be present at the Public Information Centre to answer questions and discuss the next steps in the study. Notification of the Public Information Centre will be provided at the appropriate time by means of a similar advertisement in this newspaper.

Upon completion, a Class EA Report will be prepared to document the planning process followed, including conclusions and recommendations, and how public input was received and considered. The Class EA Report will be available for public review for a period of 30 calendar days. At that time, notification of the review period and Class EA Report locations will be made by means of a similar newspaper notice and a letter mailed to those on the project contact list.

NOTICE OF COMPLETION

Sanitary Sewer Main and Sewerage Forcemain in Future Louis St. Laurent Blvd. from Approximately 420 metres East of Tremaine Road (Regional Road 22) to Regional Road 25, Town of Milton Class Environmental Assessment

To allow for the wastewater (sanitary sewage) servicing of Sherwood Survey Secondary Plan lands and future Milton Phase 3 lands, the Halton Region is proposing to construct a sanitary sewer and sewerage forcemain in future Louis St. Laurent Blvd. from approximately 420 metres East of Tremaine Road (Regional Road 22) to Regional Road 25. Subject to the necessary approvals, the project is planned to be completed in the spring of 2007.

The above project is being planned under **Schedule B** of the **Municipal Class Environmental Assessment**. Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Halton Region intends to proceed with the design and construction of this project.

Interested parties should provide written comments to Halton on the proposal within 30 calendar days from the date of this notice. Comments should be directed to Mr. Laird Smith as noted below.

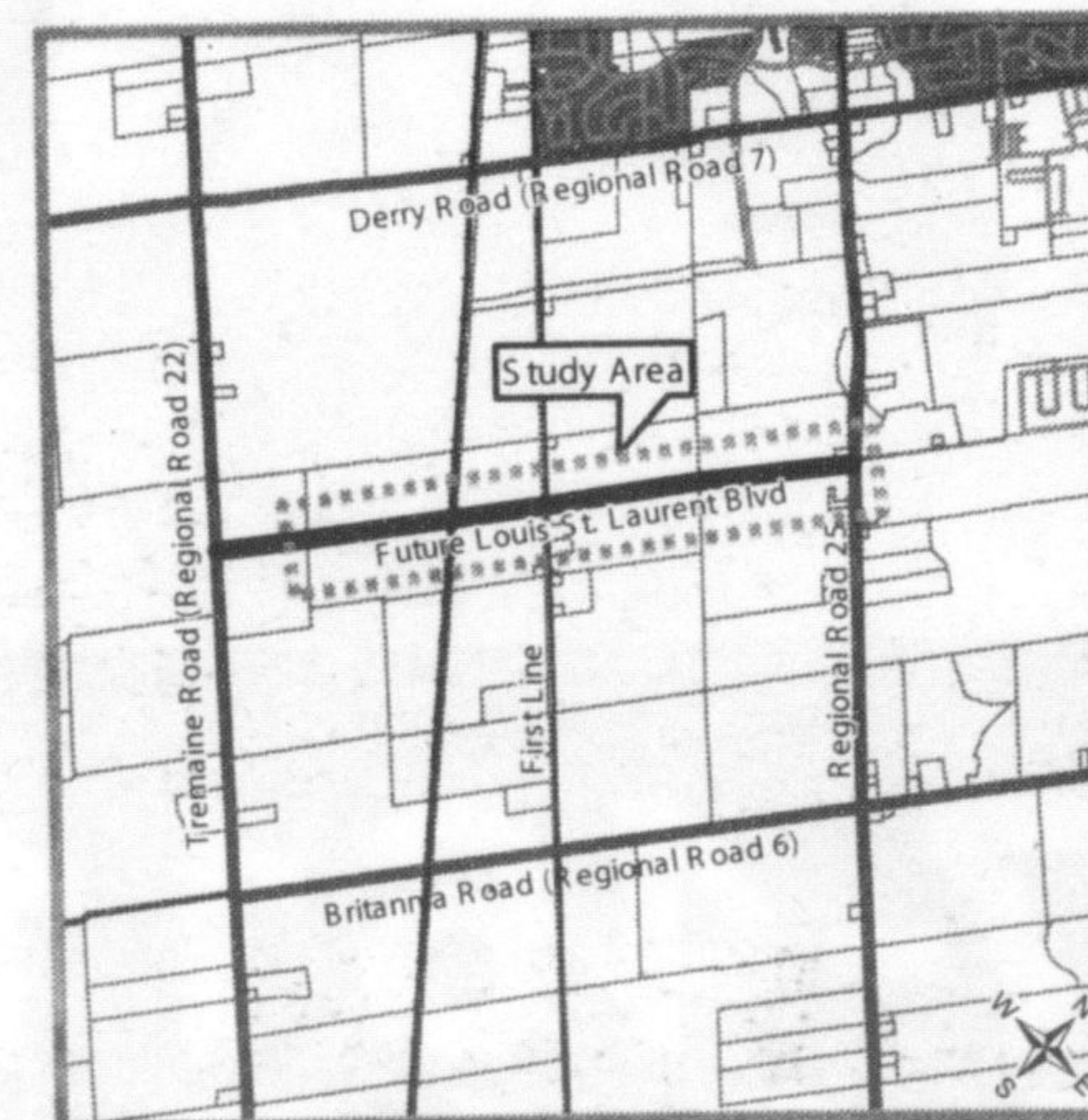
If concerns arise regarding this project which cannot be resolved in discussion with Halton, a person or party may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environment assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below within 30 calendar days of this notice. A copy of this request must also be sent to the Halton Region. If there is no request received by October 24, 2006, the Sanitary Sewer Main and Sewerage Forcemain in Future Louis St. Laurent Blvd. will proceed to design and construction as presented in the planning documentation.
