

# Truck stolen from quarry

A pick-up truck was among the property stolen from a Dublin Line quarry sometime between Saturday and Monday.

Police said unknown suspects got on to the property by cutting off the gate lock and entered several outbuildings.

They stole two-way radios, cash and a pick-up truck containing assorted tools.

The pick-up truck is an unuplaid 2001 Ford F150 valued at \$5,000. The value of the other property is estimated at \$2,000.
