Beginning this fall, all residential water/wastewater charges in Halton will be billed on a bi-monthly basis.

Local hydro companies bill water/wastewater charges on behalf of Halton Region. Until now, some residential water customers in Halton were billed every month, while the majority were billed every two months. Starting with your November or December 2006 bill (depending on your meter reading date), you will see water/wastewater charges billed every two months. Hydro charges for Milton customers will continue to be billed on a monthly basis.

Halton Region initiated this change to standardize water/wastewater billing for all Halton residential customers in order to provide consistent and cost effective service levels across the Region.
