Loblaws Companies Ltd. is reportedly seeking cost cuts to stay competitive with retail giant Wal-Mart, which continues to expand the grocery sections in its stores.

More than 95 per cent of the company's 27,000 unionized employees across Ontario voted for a strike mandate.
