## Dufferin recognized for its quarry rehab

Dufferin Aggregates' Milton quarry has received top honours from the Canadian Land Reclamation Association (CLRA).

The local operation recently won the Dr. Edward M. Watkin award for its rehabilitation work at the quarry.
