Currently, the zoning on the land allows for office, light industrial and commercial uses such as the fitness centre and daycare presently located there.

Ward 4 candidate John Daly expressed concerns about traffic impacts the development could have on the surrounding residential area.

And during both public meetings, Wards 2 and 4 candidate Nicki Ward questioned when sidewalks would be installed around the proposed developments.

Octavian's plan would also require a change in zoning from employment to special employment and an Official Plan amendment.

The committee received reports on both proposals for information purposes.

The next step in the process is for council to adopt an Official Plan amendment on the Town's retail commercial policies, which results from the aforementioned retail commercial demand study. Public consultation on the amendment is expected to take place early next year.

Then, once all comments have been received on the proposals and staff has evaluated them, it will bring recommendations forward on whether to approve or deny them to future meetings.


