# Hurricanes snap skid

The midget Hurricanes brought their early-season skid to an end at Memorial Arena Saturday afternoon — thanks in no small part to a local trio.

Ryan Williams was nothing short of brilliant between the pipes, while fellow Miltonians Brayden Abraham and Matt Welna scored shorthanded goals just 19 seconds apart in the first period and were instrumental in killing off several other penalties.

As a result, the Hurricanes snagged an early lead and hung on to beat the Hamilton Bulldogs 4-2 for their first league

win after opening the season with four straight losses. Welna put Halton ahead 2-0 on a point-blank shot midway through the first, while Abraham caught the Bulldogs' goalie out of position just moments later and fired a lengthy wrister that found its way through a sea of bodies to cushion the hosts' lead.

At the opposite end, Williams was especially effective when challenged down low and made at least a handful of spectacular saves through the early going to keep Hamilton snipers at bay.

The second goal against him came on a second-period two-man advantage. Otherwise the Hurricanes — Abraham and Welna in particular — were exceptional on the penalty kill.

Halton's midgets include six Milton-area players this season, with the other three all sidelined Saturday. Dane Horvat and James Woodcroft were serving suspensions, while Scott Stover continued to nurse a broken finger.

# Memorable pro debuts for locals

A couple of 22-year-old Miltonians made their professional hockey debuts last week - and both had more than just participatory roles in their teams' victories.

Now playing back-up with the Central Hockey League's Wichita Thunder — coached by fellow Milton native Mark French — Dan Giffin made his first start one to remember.

Giffin was particularly effective in the second period — with a dozen straight saves — while both goals against him came on the powerplay, the first on a two-man advantage.


The victory lifted the Thunder to 3on the year.


Squaring off against the provincial






The rebuilding juniors have now been held to a goal or less in seven of their last 10 games.
