## Orpen claims provincial bronze


Kelsy Orpen can be excused for being less than serious in the classroom.

"We didn't want to go home with nothing," said the former standout with both the Milton Youth Soccer Club and Bishop Reding Secondary School, whose Hawks edged Fleming Peterborough 1-0 in the quarterfinals October 21.






